TIPS FOR HATS LESSON

INTRODUCTION INFO:

- GWB Presidential Library & Museum is run by the National Archives & Record Administration
- Not a normal library it is an ARCHIVE to store documents, artifacts from a president's time in office and displayed for the public
- GWB #43 Library has over 6 million pages, 400 million photographs & 43,000 artifacts
- Hats Activity is a deductive reasoning activity students will be "detectives" to learn the powers of the President (given in the US Constitution)
- Each "HAT" PowerPoint Slide represents one of the roles of the President He has to wear many hats in the process of doing his job.
- Students will use the records on the power point presentation to detect the jobs of the President.

HOW TO VIEW THE POWER POINT SLIDES:

- For each slide, first look at the photo or document. Then ask yourself these questions:
 - o What is the main idea of the picture of document?
 - o Can you see words? What do they say?
 - Who are the people in the picture? Do you know them? What jobs might they have?
 - o Is this a picture of an "object"?
 - What does the object represent or "say" to you? What is its purpose?
- Once you have analyzed the picture or document, read the caption & then look at the picture again.
- If the slide has an audio or video icon, play & listen to them.
- Talk to your partner & decide what clues to write down in the middle column.
- Repeat these steps for each slide.

Finally answer the questions at the bottom of each column & draw a picture at the top to remind you.
HINT - IF YOU GET LOST OR DON'T UNDERSTAND ONE OF THE
SLIDES - SKIP IT AND MOVE ON You can come back later

SLIDES – SKIP IT AND MOVE ON. You can come back later. Remember you are a DETECTIVE and must learn as much as possible very quickly. You don't have to learn ALL the information given.

CLOSING QUESTIONS:

- 1. What role was a surprise to you? Which one did you already know?
- 2. What Presidential role is the most important, in your opinion? Why?
- 3. Do you think the President could skip doing any of these roles? Why or why not?
- 4. If you were President, which role would be your favorite and why?
- 5. Discuss with your partner, then create a sentence that summarizes the roles of the President.
- 6. How does what you have learned today fit into what you have been learning about the President in class?
