Md. Marine Dies in Fight For Fallujah

Early in his prep school days in Baltimore, Nick Ziolkowski decided that he wanted to go into the military, and he pursued that ambition with a steadfastness that the other students wished they shared.

"Every other kid envied him his clarity," said Ab Logan, who taught English to Ziolkowski in his senior year at Boys' Latin School. "It was his sense of purpose that just made him everybody's hero."

The death of Marine Corps Lance Cpl. Nicholas Lee Ziolkowski, 22, of Towson, Md., "in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom," was announced yesterday by the Defense Department.

The Pentagon provided no details. Ziolkowski's father, Andrew, of Germantown, said in a written statement that "it is believed that he was killed by a mortar round and fell into his squad's heavy combat before he was lost" in the assault on Fallujah.

The father wrote that his son's captain "wanted ten more guys like Nick. He had the patience, temperament and fortitude to do the job."

In school, Ziolkowski captained the cross-country team in 2000 and had been on the swimming team, cross-country Coach Bill Pheil said.

English teacher Logan described Ziolkowski as a "generous, fun, warmhearted kid," distinguished by the sense of purpose that "just lit him on fire" and drove him to "push himself academically and physically."

Based on journals he kept, Ziolkowski, whose father said he intended to come home next year and attend college, "could have been a writer," Logan said.

The father also quoted Nick's brother Peter as saying that Nick and a friend "dreamed of going to Cancun [in Mexico] and opening a surf shop."

Ziolkowski "was a true hero," his brother Peter said in the statement. "I lost a good and kind brother."

Ziolkowski's survivors, in addition to his father and brother Peter, include his mother, Tracy Miller of Towson, another brother, Alex, a sister, Julia, and a grandmother.

The father said in his statement that his son "began planning for his military service when he was in ninth grade. He ran for miles every day and worked out constantly to get himself in the best shape possible."

Nick enlisted after his 2001 graduation from Boys' Latin. He was in the 1st Battalion, 8th Marine Regiment, 2nd Marine Division, 2nd Marine Expeditionary Force based at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, N.C.

"Nick joined the Marines firmly believing he could help make the world a better place," his father said in the statement.

He said services would be held at Arlington National Cemetery on Nov. 24.



He was one of the few Army ROTC cadets selected to undergo and successfully pass the rigorous Underwater Operations (SCUBA) course. He graduated with distinction and was a Distinguished Military Graduate.

Funeral arrangements are pending.

UPDATE - Nov. 30, 2004

Luke will be buried at Arlington National Cemetery on **Tuesday, Dec. 7, 2004**, with full military honors. **Everyone attending should appear by 2:30 p.m.** at the administrative building near the main gate. The horse drawn caisson carrying Luke's casket will leave the administrative building promptly at 3:00 p.m. Attendees may either walk behind the caisson to the grave site or be transported there by motor vehicle. Pastor George McDearmon will officiate at the grave.

Lewiston High grad dies in Iraq

Luke C. Wullenwaber, Army officer, was 24

By DEAN A. FERGUSON and CHARITY THOMPSON OF THE TRIBUNE

A bomb blast Tuesday in the Iraqi desert killed a Lewiston soldier and sent shock waves through his hometown.

Family and friends are trying to reconcile how a man of such extraordinary drive and courage could be struck down.

U.S. Army 1st Lt. Luke C. Wullenwaber, 24, was killed while on a security mission in Khaladlyah, 80 kilometers west of Baghdad. A suicide bomber detonated a car bomb next to Wullenwaber's military vehicle, according to an Army press release.

Wullenwaber is the seventh soldier with ties to this area killed in the Iraq War.

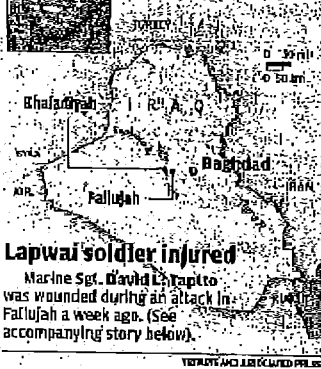
Wullenwaber's parents, Bonnie and Dean, of Lewiston, grieved in private, declining invitations to comment. His brother, Levi, and sister Kara both live in Lewiston. His younger brother, Jesse, is a cadet at the Virginia Military Institute, from which Wullenwaber graduated in 2002.

the most important person in the world," said Mike Jones, 24, one of Wullenwaber's best friends since their days at Jennifer Junior High School. "He was a good son, he was a good friend and he was a good brother."

Wullenwaber graduated from Lewiston High School in 1998. He was a football standout, who at 5-foot-6-inches and 145 pounds packed a wallop twice his size on the field. He holds the school record for six quarterback sacks in one game.

"Everything in his life was full-bore, 100 percent," said his former football coach, Nick Menegas. "He was an immense inspiration to all of us."

Menegas uses a video of Wullenwaber on the field to teach summer football camps.

"Everyone marvels at the overachieving that he demonstrates on every down."

Wullenwaber applied that same drive to all aspects of his life, said Menegas. "He was the epitome of what a man should be."

Although they knew full well that Wullenwaber served in a hostile land, his friends reacted with shock when they learned early Wednesday of his death.

"I thought the odds were in his favor," said a tearful Annie Peterson, 23, of Seattle. "He was so well trained and so courageous and such a good soldier. I never thought this would happen."

Peterson, who met Wullenwaber in a high school chemistry class, dated him after high school and kept in close touch.

Because Wullenwaber's work was confidential, he didn't share specifics of his military

service. However, the military institute notes he was one of few Army ROTC cadets to pass the Underwater Operations (SCUBA) course and he graduated with distinction. He also passed the Ranger School and Airborne School before assignment to the 1st Battalion, 506th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Infantry Division, in Camp Greaves, Korea.

Peterson and Jones both remember Wullenwaber's dream of living on the ocean — perhaps in Cuba after Castro dies — and opening a diving and surfing shop.

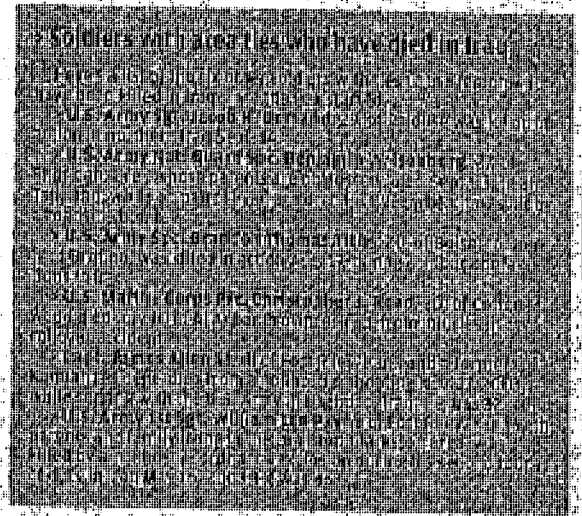
"I think what he'd really love to be remembered for is his love of life and how much he respected his family," said Peterson. "They meant the world to him."

Wullenwaber's service in Iraq began in the late summer. He was stationed in Habbinyah near Fallujah.

"Luke was very positive about being a servant to our country," said a family friend, Deidre Ater, 26, of Ellensburg. "He wanted to be over there."

He was interested in the military from a young age, participating in the Young Marines in junior high school and studying war history for fun in high school.

It was no surprise when he went to the military institute after high school. Karen Rinebold, 47, a family friend from Lewiston, described the institute as a prestigious school



for the military-minded.

"Everyone who goes there has a very tough course to make it through," she said.

Wullenwaber's loyalty is evident in stories from the Rinebold and Ater families, whose members knew him since childhood.

He kept close ties with Jason Rinebold, 25, of Lewiston, and Austin Ater, 24, of Asotin, for 20 years, from their kindergarten days until he left for Iraq this summer.

"I hardly have a junior high school or high school memory that doesn't have Luke in it," said Jason Rinebold.

The three went to school together at Logos kindergarten in Moscow and Shiloh Christian School in Lewiston. As teens they shared experiences as athletes and Young Marines. They camped together every summer for the last five years and planned to camp again as soon as Wullenwaber could get leave.

"He'd come home and it was like he'd never been gone," Jason Rinebold said. "It was the same with Austin."

Wullenwaber and Austin Ater took their first road trip together when they were 17. They flew to central California to pick up a 1973 gold Cadillac, which belonged to

Wullenwaber's grandmother, and drove it back to Lewiston.

"The day they arrived it was a hot afternoon," recalls Austin Ater's mother, Tisa, of Asotin. "They pulled up, took their shirts off and jumped in the swimming pool. They yelled and screamed and swam. (They were) in the prime of their lives."

She paused after this memory in tears.

"I believe there are many people who would consider Luke a best friend," said Karen Rinebold. "He had a way of treating everybody like they were in a brotherhood."

"Nothing was intimidating to him or out of his range. His sense of humor never quit."

Wullenwaber would have been 25 in December.

"I just mailed him his birthday package on Monday, and so did his mom," Karen Rinebold said.

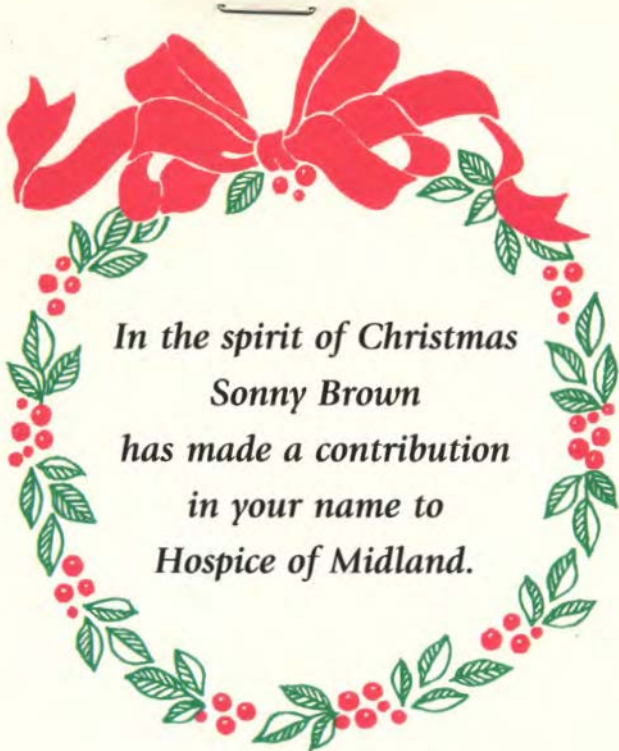



Dear President Bush:

This administration and the Republican Party needs to get off the defensive on the offensive in regards to the stem cell issue. We need to be for the patients and for right to life not merely against embryonic stem cell research. The National Cord Blood Stem Cell Act legislation already in Congress S-681 and HR-596 (see attached) can allow this "high road" strategy to proceed now! The major talking points and background for this legislation are as follows:

National Cord Blood Stem Cell Act

BIPARTISAN: S.681 and HR 596, "National Cord Blood Stem Cell Act" are **bi-partisan** bills---supported by Democrats and Republicans and those for and against embryonic stem cell research. .

GOALS: The goal of the bill is to **build the national inventory** of available cord blood stem cell units **and save lives**. Specifically, the bill calls for collecting 150,000 cryopreserved (frozen) units to greatly improve the chance an individual awaiting a bone marrow transplant will find a suitably matched unit.

According to the General Accounting Office (GAO, Oct 2002), less than **25% of the patients** in need are able to **find a** suitable unrelated bone marrow stem cell **match** in time. Further, ethnic minorities have only half the probability of finding a match as Caucasians.

Cord Blood Stem Cell transplants work. Over the last 10 years, more than 6,000 patients have received such transplants to treat more than 60 malignant and genetic diseases, including leukemia, lymphoma, Sickle Cell Anemia, Thalassemia, inherited metabolic and storage diseases and Immune Deficiencies.

This legislation strives to assure that **80% of Americans** of all ethnicities **will find a suitable stem cell match** when needed. Cord Blood Stem Cell units are more forgiving than bone marrow when it comes to finding a suitable match. Bone marrow harvested from a living person must be an exact match to assure a successful outcome – the "match rate" needs to be 6 of 6 antigens and can be found through a sibling or unrelated donor. However, cord blood stem cells are more adaptable and 150,000 units can assume

an 80% chance of finding a suitable match (4 of 6 antigens). Passage of this bill can **save thousands of lives** each year.

RESEARCH: this legislation **supports biomedical research**. It accelerates broad clinical applications of, and support research on, highly competent stem cells in cord blood – stem cells that can be harvested without risk to human life or donor. In addition, these units are collected from the umbilical cord during birth, stored and available immediately based on need.

FISCALLY RESPONSIBLE: this **legislation is fiscally responsible**. Federal funds are needed as “capital building” to build the inventory. Once the required inventory is obtained, the Banks will be self-financing from reimbursement fees and no additional, permanent costs will be accrued to the Federal budget.

FEDERAL OVERSIGHT: **Cord Blood Stem Cells will have appropriate federal oversight**. Cord Blood Stem Cells are currently under review by the FDA for licensure as the first ever licensed Stem Cell product.

BACKGROUND

Facts about Cord Blood Stem Cells and Embryonic Stem Cells:

- There are three distinct types (and sources) of stem cells: Embryonic (from embryos,) Adult (from bone marrow) and Neonatal (from **placental/umbilical cord blood** collected after a healthy baby is born.)
- Only two of these “three” sources of Stem Cells have ever been used to save a patient's life: Adult (bone marrow) and neonatal (**Cord Blood**)

Additional points to consider:

- As reported in the recent sobering New York Times Op Ed article by Nicholas Kristof, the threat of a “dirty bomb” incident in the United States is a real concern ...more a question of When?... than If? The national inventory of cryopreserved **Cord Blood Stem Cells** would be the **only source** of stem cells that could be **timely utilized for** suitable patient/victims in such a **bioterrorist event**. Bone marrow relies on volunteer, living donors – finding them, receiving their consent and scheduling a medical procedure to extract the marrow. It is not immediately available. Cord Blood Stem Cell units are shipped out immediately and can be delivered within 24 hours.
- In the last 12 months alone, numerous peer review articles have reported that **Cord Blood Stem Cells** are **pluripotent** – meaning they can be differentiated into bone, brain, heart and liver cells and thus may provide useful replacement cells for diseases like Parkinson's, diabetes, spinal cord damage and myocardial infarction.

- President George W. **Bush was the “first” President to authorize federal funding for “Embryonic” Stem Cell research.** This President appears committed to a responsible and comprehensive policy on Stem Cells and is personally motivated to finding cures for all lethal and debilitating diseases as he has shared the anguish of many American families, having lost a sister to Leukemia.
