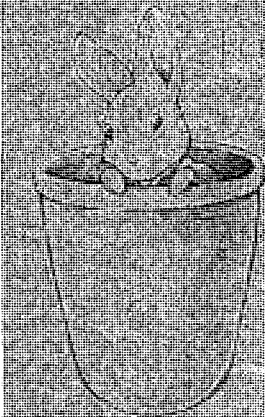

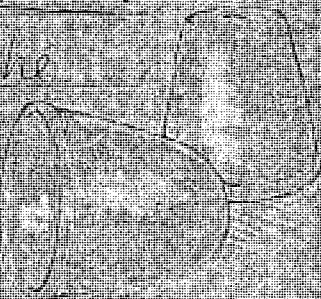

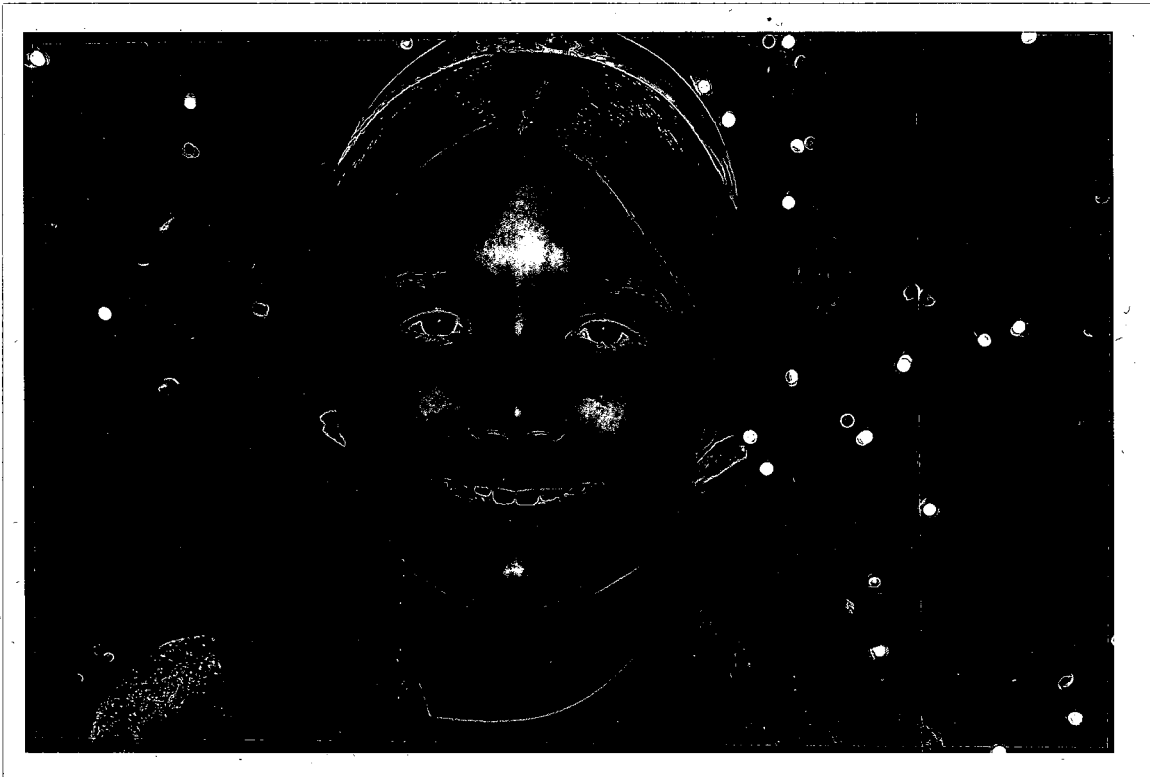

BACKGROUND INFORMATION ON PARTICIPANTS

Gary Bauer, Founder and President, American Values (Fairfax, Virginia)

Gary Bauer has been President of American Values since he founded the non-profit educational organization after the 2000 presidential campaign. The organization was founded to advocate conservative principles such as the sanctity of life, marriage, family, faith, and freedom. In 1996, Gary launched the Campaign for Working Families, one of today's largest conservative political action committees.

Jeff Bell, Principal, Capital City Partners (Annandale, Virginia)

Jeff Bell is a Principal at Capital City Partners, LLC, a consulting firm whose clients include national political, policy, and charitable organizations. He is a member of the American Conservative Union Board of Directors, and has been involved in national politics for over three decades, including key roles in the campaigns of Presidents Nixon and Reagan.

Chuck Colson, Founder, Prison Fellowship Ministries (Naples, Florida)

Chuck Colson founded Prison Fellowship Ministries in 1976, which has become the world's largest outreach to prisoners, ex-prisoners, crime victims, and their families. One of the key goals of the ministries is to exhort, equip, and assist the church in facilitating reconciliation among offenders, victims, their families, and communities. It maintains more than 40,000 prison ministry volunteers in more than 100 countries. Chuck is a published author who served in the Nixon White House.

Kenneth Cribb, Jr., Chairman, Council for National Policy (Wilmington, Delaware)

Ken Cribb is the Chairman of the Council for National Policy, a committee of over 800 conservative leaders from across the country committed to influencing national policy towards center-right ideals. He has also been President of the Intercollegiate Studies Institute since 1989, following his tenure as Domestic Policy Advisor to President Reagan. The Institute brings together more than 50,000 college students and more than 900 college representatives from campuses across the country in an effort to educate students on the economic, spiritual, and political ideals that are needed to sustain democracy.

Dr. Janice Crouse, Senior Fellow, The Beverly LaHaye Institute (Laurel, Maryland)

Dr. Crouse is the senior fellow at The Beverly LaHaye Institute, the public policy division of Concerned Women for America, a pro-life and pro-family advocacy group. She also served as a speechwriter for Vice President Dan Quayle. She served as a U.S. delegate to the United Nations Children's Summit in 2002 and then as a member of the U.S. delegation to the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women in 2003.

Dr. James Dobson, Founder and Chairman, Focus on the Family (Colorado Springs, Colorado)

Dr. Dobson is the Founder and Chairman of Focus on the Family, a non-profit organization that advocates pro-family policies and programs. It also produces Jim's internationally syndicated radio programs and helps to publish his books on the institution of the family. Before founding Focus on the Family, he served for 17 years on the Attending Staff of Children's Hospital of Los Angeles in the Division of Child Development and Medical Genetics.

Leonard Leo, Executive Vice President, the Federalist Society for Law and Public Policy Studies (Arlington, Virginia)

Since 1992, Leonard has served the Federalist Society, an organization of 35,000 national and local members, with chapters at 180 American law schools and lawyer chapters in 60 cities. It is dedicated to principles of limited government, the separation of powers, the rule of law, and the idea that the role of the courts is to interpret the law. Before joining the Federalist Society, Leonard served as a law clerk to Judge A. Raymond Randolph of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit. He has also been a leader in the effort to confirm your judicial nominees to the Federal courts.

Michael Novak, Jewett Scholar in Religion, Philosophy, and Public Policy, American Enterprise Institute (Washington, D.C.)

Michael Novak holds the George Frederick Jewett Chair in Religion and Public Policy and is the Director of Social and Political Studies at the American Enterprise Institute, a conservative public policy think-tank. Mr. Novak has written 25 books on the philosophy and theology of culture. Michael is also Vice Chairman of the United States Commission on International Religious Freedom, an independent government agency that was established to monitor religious freedom throughout the world.

Janet Parshall, Radio Talk Show Host, Janet Parshall's America (Maurertown, Virginia)

Janet Parshall is the host of Janet Parshall's America, a daily, three-hour, nationally syndicated radio program committed to advocating conservative ideals and family values. In 1998, she was elected to the Board of Directors of the National Religious Broadcasters, and was elected to service on the Executive Board in 2001.

Alan Sears, President and CEO, Alliance Defense Fund (Scottsdale, Arizona)

Alan Sears is the President, CEO, and General Counsel of the Alliance Defense Fund, a legal defense fund founded to defend matters regarding religious freedom, the sanctity of life, marriage, and the family. Previously, Alan served in the Reagan Administration in the Department of Justice and Department of Interior, and in the private practice of law.

Jay Sekulow, Chief Counsel, American Center for Law and Justice (Virginia Beach, Virginia)

Jay Sekulow is Chief Counsel for the American Center for Law and Justice, a law firm and educational organization that specializes in defending the strict application of the U.S. Constitution. Jay has a nationally syndicated radio talk show and has argued before the U.S. Supreme Court in defense of constitutional freedoms.

Dr. Keith Wiebe, President, American Association of Christian Schools (Huntington, West Virginia)

Dr. Wiebe is the President of the American Association of Christian Schools, an advocacy group for Christian schools which serves over 175,000 students and teachers in approximately 1,050 member schools throughout the United States and in several foreign countries. He presently serves as Pastor of Grace Gospel Church in Huntington, West Virginia. Prior to assuming his present position, he had broad experience in church ministry at churches in Ohio and Florida.

Dr Frank Wright, President and CEO, National Religious Broadcasters (Sterling, Virginia)

Dr. Wright is President of the National Religious Broadcasters, an international association of Christian communicators responsible for the majority of Christian broadcasts in the United States. He has a long history of involvement in Christian ministry, including a 20-year association with Dr. James Kennedy's ministries.

Wendy Wright, President, Concerned Women for America (Falls Church, Virginia)

Wendy Wright is the President of Concerned Women for America, the Nation's largest public policy women's organization helping to promote legislation and international policies that are beneficial to women and families. The group was founded in 1979 by Beverly LaHaye, and currently has 500,000 members nationwide.
