

I. PURPOSE

To speak to the students of the Junior Statesman Summer School at Georgetown University.

II. BACKGROUND

The Junior Statesman Summer School at Georgetown University combines academics with hands-on learning. The students, in their study of government, participate in nightly student debates and a Speakers Program. Lectures, class discussions, and political simulations detail the basic tenets of political science. Students enroll in the particular studies of American Government, U.S. Foreign Policy, Constitutional Law, and the Presidency.

Throughout the program, the students are able to meet and question national leaders, including Congressional leaders, Cabinet members, lobbyists and journalists. Students watch the House and Senate in session, and attend Congressional hearings. The trips are organized and chaperoned by the Speakers Program staff, RAs and the Summer School Director.

In a Congressional workshop, the students put their knowledge into action by creating and running a legislative body patterned after the U.S. Congress with nightly student debates on current policy issues.

Past speakers for the Junior Statesmen include President George H.W. Bush, Secretary Colin Powell, Ari Fleisher, Karl Rove, Senator Trent Lott, and Bob Dole.


John Whitehead began his professional career at Goldman, Sachs & Co. in 1947 and remained there for 38 years, retiring as Co-Chairman and Senior Partner in 1984. During that time, Goldman Sachs became one of the world's preeminent investment banking and brokerage firms. Mr. Whitehead served as U.S. Deputy Secretary of State from 1985 to 1989, and was subsequently awarded the Presidential Citizens Medal by President Reagan. Since leaving Washington, Mr. Whitehead has been active in a wide range of educational, civic and charitable organizations. He has served as Chairman of the Board of the United Nations Association of the United States, the Asia Society, the Harvard University Board of Overseers, and the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, among other institutions. Mr. Whitehead currently serves as Chairman of the Lower Manhattan Redevelopment Corporation, the entity charged with rebuilding Lower Manhattan following the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001. Mr. Whitehead co-founded FSVC with the late Cyrus R. Vance in 1990.



never been FSVC was founded in 1990 by John Whitehead and the late Cyrus Vance at the behest of President George H.W. Bush. The organization's work initially focused on Central and Eastern Europe and has expanded eastward over subsequent years. FSVC has worked in twenty-seven countries to date to deliver objective expert advice focused at both the technical and senior policy levels. FSVC's core work concentrates on the strengthening of commercial banking systems, the development of central bank capabilities, and the building of capital markets. Major additional areas of work include the legal framework for the financial system, payments system development, pension reform, and the combating of financial corruption and terrorist finance.

> FSVC has leveraged approximately \$45 million in USAID funding since 1990 to provide nearly \$150 million in technical assistance, principally through the involvement of private-sector volunteer experts. These volunteer experts are typically prominent in their fields, in the prime of their careers and at the leading edge of financial market work. Nearly 2,100 experts from the financial, legal and regulatory communities have taken part in over 1,100 FSVC missions, reaching nearly 30,000 counterparts in developing and transition countries. FSVC currently operates its two largest programs in Russia and Indonesia.

FSVC's Board is currently co-chaired by Mr. Whitehead and Paul Volcker. John Walker serves as the President of the Board. FSVC's Executive Director is Andrew Spindler.
