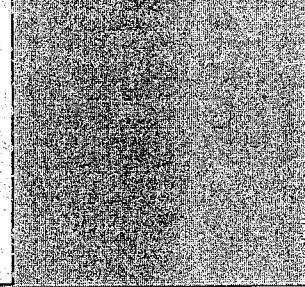

I. PURPOSE

To highlight your Administration's agenda for improving teacher quality.

II. BACKGROUND

Today, as part of her *Ready to Read, Ready to Learn* initiative, Mrs. Bush is hosting the *White House Conference on Preparing Tomorrow's Teachers*. The Conference brings together university and business leaders, teacher education advocates, teachers' union representatives, members of public policy organizations, and members of foundations from across the country that have an interest in teacher quality. The Conference's goal is to help develop solutions for promoting teacher recruitment and enhancing teacher quality.

Your remarks will highlight the same themes you stressed in your visit to Minneapolis on Monday. The *No Child Left Behind Act* requires that, by the end of the 2005-2006 school year, there be a "highly qualified" teacher in every classroom. This is a key step in effectively implementing the *No Child Left Behind Act*.

Both the *Act* and your budget provide states and their school districts with multiple tools to help them meet new teacher quality requirements. Conference participants will receive a copy of "A Quality Teacher in Every Classroom," which is a booklet that describes for state and local policymakers the key Federal programs and resources available to help them to recruit, train, and retain highly qualified teachers. These programs provide states and school districts with \$4 billion in Federal funds to improve teacher quality.

Key programs include:

- A \$2.85 billion flexible grant program, funded in FY2002, will provide states with resources to recruit and train teachers and principals. This represents an increase of 35 percent over FY2001 levels, and your FY2003 budget maintains this level of funding.
- Programs to promote alternative routes to becoming a teacher, including Troops to Teachers, Transition to Teaching, and Teach for America.
- Programs to help train teachers in specific areas of need, including early childhood education, reading instruction, bilingual education, special education, math and science, history, and technology.

- A "What Works" clearinghouse to provide educators with information on educational products, practices, and programs that are effective in enhancing student results.
- The Teacher Protection Act, which ensures that teachers, principals, and other school professionals can undertake reasonable actions to maintain order and discipline in the classroom, without fear of litigation.
- A Teacher Tax deduction, proposed in your FY2003 budget, to help teachers defray out-of-pocket classroom expenses of up to \$400. The cost of this initiative is \$16 million in FY2004 and \$577 million over the first five years.
- Expanded Loan Forgiveness, proposed in your FY2003 budget, will expand to \$17,500 student loan forgiveness for math, science, and special education teachers who commit to teach in high-need schools for five years. The total cost of this initiative is \$45 million in FY2003 and \$112 million over five years.

I. PURPOSE

To meet with the leader of the Eastern Orthodox Church and highlight the importance of tolerance and interfaith cooperation.

II. BACKGROUND

Addressed as: Your All Holiness

Religious and Historical Significance

Archbishop Bartholomew's official title, Ecumenical Patriarch of Istanbul/Constantinople, reflects his important place in the global Christian hierarchy. His See in Istanbul is the successor to the "Eastern" or "Orthodox" Church community established by Roman Emperor Constantine in the 4th Century. Archbishop Bartholomew is the most revered of all Orthodox leaders, and he is the head of the Greek Orthodox Churches of the United States, South America, Australia, and several thousand Greek-speaking Orthodox believers in Turkey.

Archbishop Bartholomew, however, is not the head of the Orthodox Church of Greece. The Greeks rejected the Ecumenical Patriarch's authority upon gaining independence from the Ottoman Empire in 1821. Orthodox Churches in Russia, Ukraine, Armenia, Georgia, and the Balkans are similarly headed by independent patriarchs. Archbishop Bartholomew is considered the first among equals.

Following this meeting, Archbishop Bartholomew will travel to New York City for discussions with Greek Orthodox leaders, a celebration of the 80th anniversary of the Greek-Orthodox Archdiocese of America, a visit to the former site of a Greek Orthodox church at Ground Zero, and a meeting with President Bush (41) and Mrs. Barbara Bush.

Ecumenism, Terrorism, and Environmentalism

During the past ten years, Archbishop Bartholomew has led what he terms a "Mission of Peace in the Muslim World," pursuing inter-faith understanding. Following

September 11, he gathered leaders of Christianity, Islam, and Judaism in Brussels and Istanbul to condemn terrorism and violence committed in the name of religion. In January, Archbishop Bartholomew carried this message to Tehran and then to the Vatican, where he met with the Holy Father, Pope John Paul II.

Archbishop Bartholomew is also known as "The Green Patriarch" for his championing of environmental causes. Many Turks take considerable pride in his environmentalism.

Greek-Turkish Relations

Archbishop Bartholomew, like all Ecumenical Patriarchs, is a native-born citizen of Turkey. His dual Greek-Turkish identity and ecumenical message often help him foster closer relations between Greece and Turkey. However, many Turkish Muslims and Greek Orthodox believers view the Ecumenical Patriarch as subject to undue Greek or Turkish influence, respectively.

The most contentious issue in Archbishop Bartholomew's relations with Turkey is the continued closure of the Halki Seminary. Located on an island off the coast of Istanbul, Halki is the Ecumenical Patriarch's main theological school. The Turkish Government closed the seminary in 1971. Ankara has subsequently rebuffed pleas by various patriarchs, Greek Americans, U.S. Ambassadors, and President Clinton to reopen Halki. The Turkish Government cites fear of setting a precedent that could lead to establishment of schools for training in Islamic laws ("madrasas") and the spread of Islamic fundamentalism.
