I. PURPOSE

To promote baseball and foster a spirit of teamwork for America's youth. Today's game also honors the men and women of our Armed Forces – and their families – who have sacrificed so much to defend our Nation.

II. BACKGROUND

This is the third year of your White House tee ball initiative. There have been three games each year and this is the first game of the 2003 season.

Today's game will be the tee ball version of the famous Army-Navy football game. The Army's Fort Belvoir (Virginia) Little League Braves will face the Naval Base Norfolk (Virginia) Little League Yankees. Once again, Little League Baseball and its sponsors chose the teams, and provided the equipment, uniforms, and funding for the White House tee ball games.

Although teams from the Army and the Navy are featured, members of all branches of the Armed Forces will participate in today's event during the pre-game program and as members of the audience. Additionally, a parent from every branch of the service has a child playing in today's game. Each child's uniform includes a special patch representing the unit his or her parent is a member of, or another unit that is located at the base. Today's audience includes a number of military families, including military personnel who served in Operation Iraqi Freedom.

The format for today's game will be identical to the format used during the previous two seasons. The only new addition to this year's program is a special volunteer recognition photo-op after the game, similar to the Freedom Corps greeter photos you have participated in during out-of-town events. Darrell Green, Chairman of your Council on Service and Civic Participation, will join you on the field after the game for a photo-op to highlight two outstanding young volunteers who participated in a number of service activities benefiting military families.

While you pose for a photo, the announcer will provide background information on the girls and will ask the audience to give them a round of applause.
- After the photo-op, the families and players will proceed to the picnic area for some food. You and Mrs. Bush will depart for the White House at your pleasure.
