RE: Presidential Remarks for Memorial Service on February 17, 2003

On Wednesday, January 29, 2003 the 140,000 square-foot West Pharmaceutical Services plant in Kinston, North Carolina was rocked by a fatal blast that left 4 workers dead and eight (8) people hospitalized of which six (6) remain critical and two (2) have been upgraded to stable condition. All are hospitalized at the North Carolina Jaycee Burn Center at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

On Monday, February 17, 2003 at 5:30 p.m. a memorial service entitled: "A Community Service of Healing and Remembrance" will be held at the Lenoir Community College in Kinston, North Carolina. As of this writing North Carolina Governor Mike Easley (D-NC) and United State Senator's Elizabeth Dole (R-NC) and John Edwards (D-NC) are arranging their schedules to speak to the six-hundred and fifty employees and their families expected to gather for this memorial. Arrangements have been made to have the service broadcast via Satellite to the patients and families at the burn center.

We would appreciate it if President Bush could send remarks to be read and distributed at the service.

The West plant in Kinston is one of the largest employers in a city of 25,000.

There have been no previous fatalities at this facility.

West Pharmaceuticals has been a leader in the rubber compounding business since 1923, the Kinston, North Carolina plant was built in 1975, with the addition of an Automated Compounding System (ACS) in 1986. At the Kinston site, rubber material is compounded and then used to manufacture syringes plungers, IV fittings, and blood

The plants that conduct the same work as the Kinston Plant are the following: Kearney, Nebraska; St. Petersburg, Florida; Lionville, Pennsylvania; and Lititz, Pennsylvania.

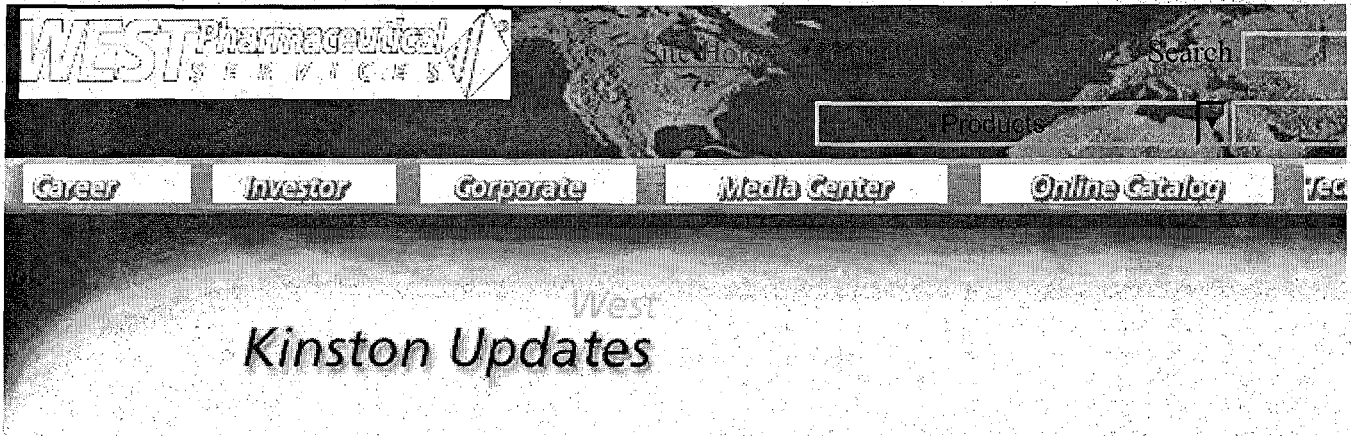

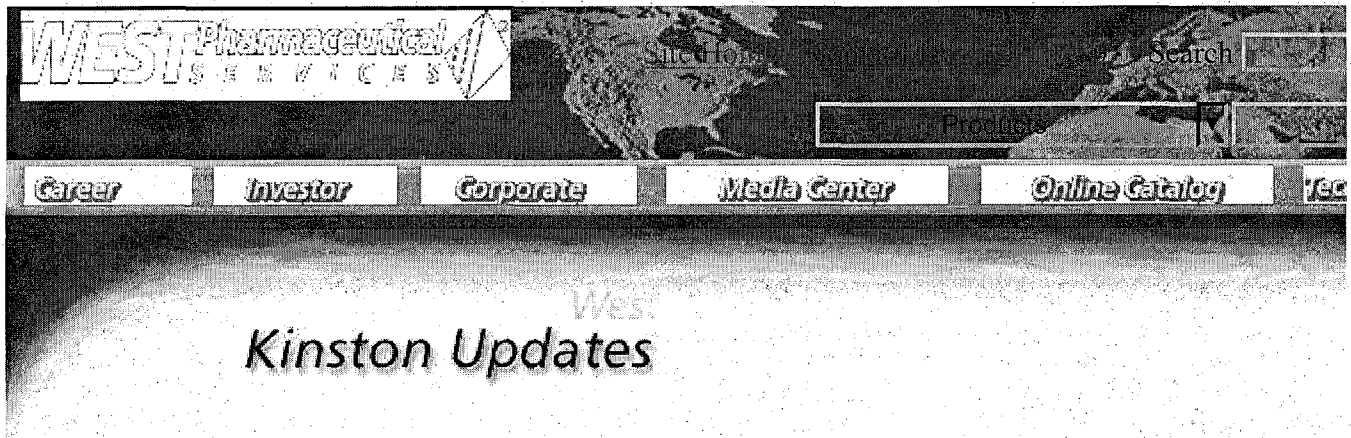

West Pharmaceutical Services Provides Update on Assessment of Manufacturing Capabilities

Lionville, PA, February 11, 2003- West Pharmaceutical Services, Inc. provides an update on the recovery and manufacturing plans in reference to the explosion that occurred at the ACS facility in North Carolina. The severely damaged building houses the Automated Compounding System (ACS) where raw materials are compounded into rubber formulations for molding into finished components in the molding and finishing area, where finished components are produced. Following the explosion, the ACS compounded rubber materials for distribution were removed from the site.

Recovery efforts at the site are well underway. Substantially all of the raw materials have been removed and are being shipped to customers subject to quality control. The ACS has been recovered and, based on a preliminary assessment, approximately 50% of the ACS has been shipped to other West facilities in Florida, Nebraska, Singapore, and Mexico. The ACS is subject to cleaning and further evaluation to determine suitability for reuse within the next two to four weeks.

To accommodate the loss of the ACS facility, some rubber compounding operations have been moved to Petersburg, Florida and Kearney, Nebraska operations, with other compounding operations to support mold tooling moved to those venues. We are meeting with all Kinston employees today regarding the impact of the explosion on them from the company, as well as alternative employment possibilities. 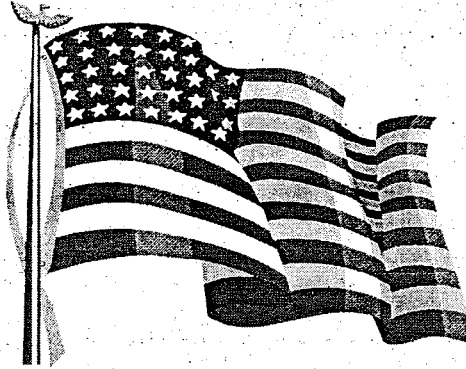

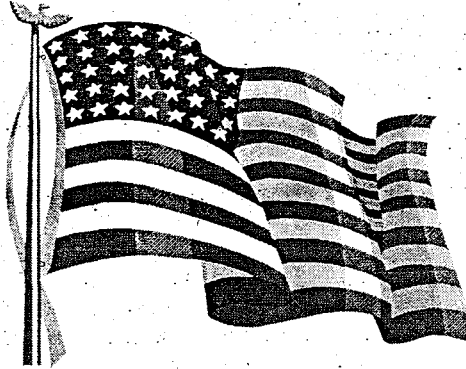
