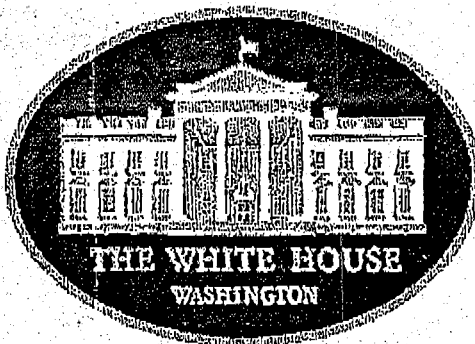



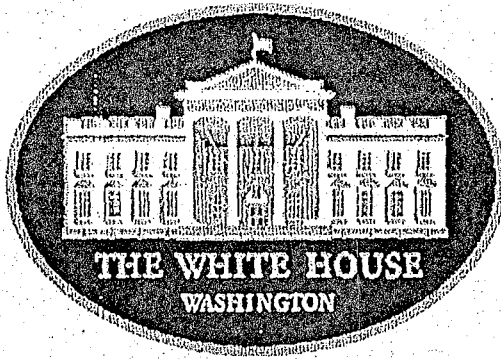
Dear Mr. President:

David Coullard of Glastonbury, Connecticut was killed on Monday, August 1, 2005. He was only 32 years old and his mother's only child. He will never have kids, get married, buy a house and his mother will never have grandchildren. I will never get the opportunity to tell him how much I loved and cared for him. I knew him for 17 years, attended high school with him and became close to him as of 3 years ago. He and I corresponded while he was in Iraq and I was looking forward to seeing him when he came home. I had already let so many years go by without telling him how I really felt, I finally told him in the last letter I wrote him and now he's gone. What is the point of all of this nonsense? How many more people do we have to lose? A very, very big mistake has been made. I am so hurt and will never get over this nor will Anita Dziedzic, his mother.

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

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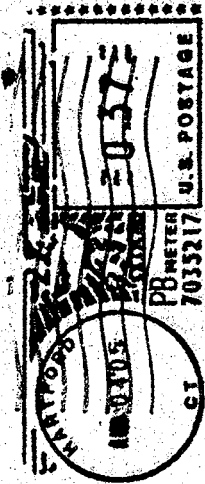

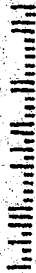

Introductory remarks by Deputy Secretary of Veterans Affairs Gordon Mansfield

Don and Buck will be presenting their "Frontline Leadership" Seminar weaving their experiences regarding preparation, focusing on the mission, dealing with obstacles and failures, creating contingencies and building

motivated leadership. As they focus on these subjects they use several powerfully moving scenes from the mini-series. Don and Buck then expand on these experiences personally and bring in the relevance of these lessons to the daily tasks and demands of everyday work.

Background on Buck Compton and Don Malarkey

Buck Compton (played by Neal McDonough in the mini-series, now on Medical Investigation) was born in Los Angeles on December 31, 1921. He had played for the UCLA baseball team with Jackie Robinson, where he was as an All-American catcher, and then for the UCLA football team that competed in the Rose Bowl on January 1, 1943. A month after the Rose Bowl, Compton attended the Officers Candidates School and underwent jump school at Fort Benning. In December 1943, as a second lieutenant, he was assigned to Easy Company, 506th Parachute Infantry Regiment of the 101st Airborne. Along with other troops from the Allied forces, Easy Company began preparing for the invasion of Europe. (49-50)

Don Malarkey (played by Scott Grimes in the mini-series, now on ER) a native of Astoria, Oregon, worked for two years after his high school graduation and was in his first semester at the University of Oregon in the fall of 1941. After Pearl Harbor, he tried to enlist in the Marines but was turned down because of dental problems, then was discouraged from joining the Air Force because he lacked the requisite high school math courses. When he was drafted in July 1942, Malarkey volunteered for the paratroops and joined Easy Company at Camp Toccoa.

Sunday, May 8, 2005 is the 60th Anniversary of the date when the Allies formally celebrated the defeat of Nazi Germany. Please join us to hear from two members of the *'Greatest Generation.'*

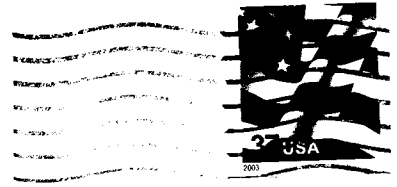

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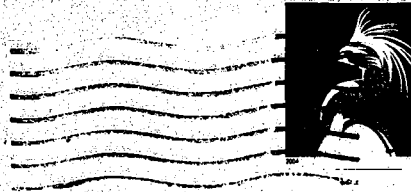

She knew. Pat Murray had a premonition. Something was wrong with her boy.

Marine Cpl. David Kreuter was stationed miles and miles away in Iraq. Still, his mother had "the gnawing feeling a parent gets when something's not right with a child."

Murray got that feeling around 10 a.m. Wednesday morning. She felt it in the pit of her stomach as she walked into the second-floor bedroom of the Miami Township home she shares with her husband, Ken Kreuter.

This was David's home as a boy. She remembers him running through the house, teasing the two little sisters, Kristin and Laura Kreuter, who idol-

ized their big brother.

Eight hours later, Murray's worst fears were realized. Her son was dead. He was 26 years old.

"He had his whole life ahead of him," his mother said. "He was so charged up about being married and being a father."

Kreuter married his college sweet heart on Sept. 10, 2004. His wife, Christina, gave birth to their son, Christian, June 14, 2005.

By the time 7-week-old Christian came into the world, Kreuter had been in Iraq for four months as a marine reservist. He saw photos of his son.

"But he never got to hold him in his arms," Murray said.

Kreuter was among 14 Marines killed Wednesday - including four other Greater Cincinnati soldiers. A roadside bomb blew up the lightly armored

amphibious assault vehicle in which they were riding.

"I always told him to walk over there," Murray said as she sat on her living room sofa. She dabbed her eyes with a tissue. "It seems like they're always getting killed when they're riding in those assault vehicles."

The phone rang constantly. Friends took the calls. Among those offering condolences was his former Boy Scout Troop leader, Mark Wiete.

"David always made everyone laugh. He was always doing funny voices," Wiete said. "He was very animated."

Wiete's son, Eric, and Kreuter belonged to the same Boy Scout troop. The best friends joined the Marines and went off to war in the same place, Iraq, but at different times.

Eric Wiete came home. His best

friend's remains should be home in a week.

"Eric's pretty shaken up about that," said his father.

A 1997 graduate of St. Xavier High School and an accomplished cross-country runner, Kreuter earned a bachelor of science degree from the University of Cincinnati in 2004.

"He planned to make a career in the Marines," said his mom.

"David told me in his last phone call that he was going to go to Officer's Training School after his tour of duty was over in Iraq," she added. "He wanted to go into something safer like working with secret codes."

At the end of their last call, Murray recalled her closing words:

"I love you very much. Be safe."
