


Dear Mr. President:

On October 20, 2005, Officer Jonathon Dragus of the Oklahoma City Police Department was killed in the line of duty leaving behind a loving wife and two young children. In late November, the officer's widow, Kelly, and his daughter, Ashlyn, both received letters of condolence from you.

The letters received from you were very touching and will be treasured memories for the family for years to come; they are seen as a testament to how valued and appreciated their father's service was. At the time the letters were sent, however, their infant son, Kaden Jacob Dragus, was too young at the time to be the recipient of a letter. Mrs. Dragus asked me to assist her respectful request that a similar letter addressed to Kaden be considered. We believe that a letter from you, would in years to come, speak greatly to him about the father he never had a chance to know.

Police: Accused murderer in U.S. illegal

Bail hearing, victim's funeral this afternoon

MILTON — Fredil Omar Rodriguez-Fuentes is an illegal alien with an outstanding deportation order against him, Milton police learned Tuesday.

Mr. Fuentes, 23, is currently in Northumberland County Prison, awaiting a preliminary hearing on charges that he stabbed Carly S. Snyder, 20, to death early Friday.

Det. Ken Royer of the Milton police said the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services, formerly the Immigration and

Naturalization Services, told him that Mr. Fuentes is a Honduran citizen and is in this country illegally.

"Mr. Fuentes is officially awaiting deportation," Mr. Royer said.

Mr. Fuentes was deported in 2000 after he was picked up in Brownsville, Tex., Mr. Royer said he was told, and he returned to this country a second time.

"He was ordered deported again, and he skipped his hearing," Mr. Royer said.

As far as Milton police have been able to determine, Mr. Fuentes has no criminal record in the United States. However, Todd

possible motive for the crime, noting that laboratory results would confirm the motive.

"We've determined that the core of Mr. Fuentes' story is true," Mr. Royer said. "It's the stuff on the edges that we have to try to piece together."

Mr. Royer and Mr. Ulrich debunked several rumors circulating in the community concerning the case.

They said they have been unable to establish any link between the victim and her killer. They also said no drugs were involved and there is no evidence that Mr. Fuentes was stalking Ms. Snyder. The officers confirmed that Ms. Snyder had sustained numerous stab wounds, but they said a rumor that she had been stabbed more than 100 times was false.

"We've been in daily contact with the family," Mr. Royer said. "We're keeping them informed of everything we learn."

Mr. Fuentes is scheduled for a bail hearing at 1:15 p.m. today before Judge Robert Sacavage in the Northumberland County courthouse.

His preliminary hearing is set for 9 a.m. Thursday before District Judge William F. Kear. That hearing was moved from Mr. Kear's Front Street office to the borough building to accommodate the spectators anticipated and to provide better security, according to Mr. Royer.

Ms. Snyder's funeral is set for 5 p.m. today at the Shaw Funeral Home, with visitation from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m.

Ulrich — another Milton officer working with Mr. Royer — said Mr. Fuentes' fingerprint record has not yet been returned by the FBI.

Mr. Fuentes was married to a Milton woman, Bobbi Rodriguez, about four years ago, police said, but that marriage does not alter his status as an illegal alien.

"The (former) INS is not responsive," Mr. Royer said. "In a criminal case, they will not do anything until after he has been tried, convicted and served his sentence. Then they will be waiting at the prison door."

"It's sad that it takes a tragedy like this to get action," Mr. Ulrich said. "If they had deported him, she might still be alive."

Mr. Royer and Mr. Ulrich said they have continued to interview people who knew the victim, Ms. Snyder, and those who know Mr. Fuentes.

"We've done 20-plus interviews so far," Mr. Ulrich said. "and we have a dozen or more yet to do."

"Everyone we interview turns up three or four more people we need to interview," Mr. Royer said.

Both officers commented that everyone they've interviewed has been cooperative. They have conducted a number of interviews with Latino neighbors of Mr. Fuentes through an interpreter, as well as interviews with others in the neighborhood and friends and acquaintances of Ms. Snyder.

Immigration officials trace Fuentes' path to Milton

MILTON — Ezeiel Omar Rodriguez Fuentes, the 23-year-old who allegedly admitted to killing 67-year-old Carly Snyder, has been identified as an illegal alien.

Standard Journal reporter earlier this week on Rodriguez Fuentes, identified as an illegal alien. Since then, the United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement (I.C.E.) agency has released the details of this Honduran native's capture and its plans for him.

According to Ernestine Fobbs, I.C.E. public affairs officer, Rodriguez Fuentes entered the country illegally in the Brownsville, Texas, area and was apprehended by the U.S. Border Patrol on Feb. 24, 2001, at that time, he did not have a criminal record and he was served with a notice to appear in court and his custody bond was set at \$5,000. That bond was posted, although Fobbs could not name the person.

Fobbs said Rodriguez Fuentes' case was transferred to Philadelphia and a deportation hearing was scheduled for Oct.

11, 2001. However, he failed to appear for that hearing and became a fugitive, and the immigration judge in Philadelphia ordered him removed from the country.

Following the murder of Snyder, the ICE in Philadelphia placed an immigration detainer on Rodriguez Fuentes. Therefore, following a trial, he will be turned over to ICE. If Rodriguez

Fuentes is found guilty, he will serve his sentence before being deported.

Fobbs said if Rodriguez Fuentes is found guilty and given the death penalty, any objections from Honduras would have to be handled between that country and the state department.

Area man dies in wreck

An inventor, a giver and much-loved son died early Tuesday morning after being involved in a one-vehicle wreck.

Sanyika Melindo Aslan Clark, 29, died about 1 a.m. of blunt force trauma, Anderson County Coroner Greg Shore said. Mr. Clark was wearing a seat belt.

Mr. Clark, who was also known as "Bim," and his girlfriend, Melinda Bailey, 37, appeared to be on their way back home to Honea Path on S.C. 252, Mr. Shore said. He was told Mr. Clark had just picked Ms. Bailey up from work at the Dugout Sports Lounge.

The 2005 four-door Nissan driven by Mr. Clark went off the right side of the road, slid about 50 feet through a yard, and then struck a telephone pole on the driver's side, according to authorities. The wreck occurred about five miles south of Belton.

Speed appeared to be a factor in the wreck, said Lance Cpl. Bryan McDougald, South Carolina Highway Patrol. The speed limit in that area is 55 mph.

Ms. Bailey was transported to AnMed Health Medical Center to be treated for a head injury, Mr. Shore said.

Mr. Clark was born in Belgium, said his father, Moses Clark. He lived in places such as Africa and Germany before moving to the United States to attend Clemson University.

Moses Clark, who lives in Alexandria, Va., said his son learned several languages, such as French, Spanish and Lingala — an African language — while living in different countries growing up. His mother, Andree, is from Belgium. His father is from the United States, but he lived in several countries while growing up.

Before the family moved from Africa to Belgium, when Sanyika Clark was only about 14 or 15 years old, he gave most of his possessions to less fortunate people.

"He gave it all away," Moses Clark said. "He was known for his willingness to help anybody. He gives the shirt off his back. That's how that boy was."

Even though Sanyika Clark has died, he is still giving to others, his father said. He donated all his organs.

Sanyika Clark moved to the United States to attend Clemson University about 10 years ago, his father said. He was majoring in computer engineering. His sister, Catherine, also attended Clemson

University. She graduated from the nursing program.

"He was super intelligent," Moses Clark said.

His only son decided to take some time off from school to work on inventions.

"He had many ideas," Moses Clark said. "He helped me with the adjustable toilet."

Moses Clark said their adjustable toilet has been patented, but not put on the market yet. He said the toilet can be adjusted to best suit the user. Moses Clark said he and his son also invented the "solar powerer" — a device that converts solar energy into electricity to power laptops and cell phones. That device is also patented, but not on the market yet.

His son had recently re-registered at Clemson University, he said.

Moses Clark said the family misses Sanyika Clark, and they're thankful for the time they were given to spend with him.

"He was a good man, and I'm thankful for that," he said.

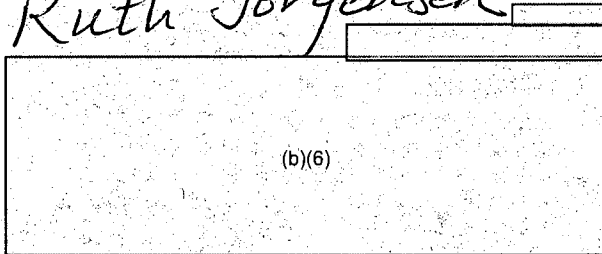

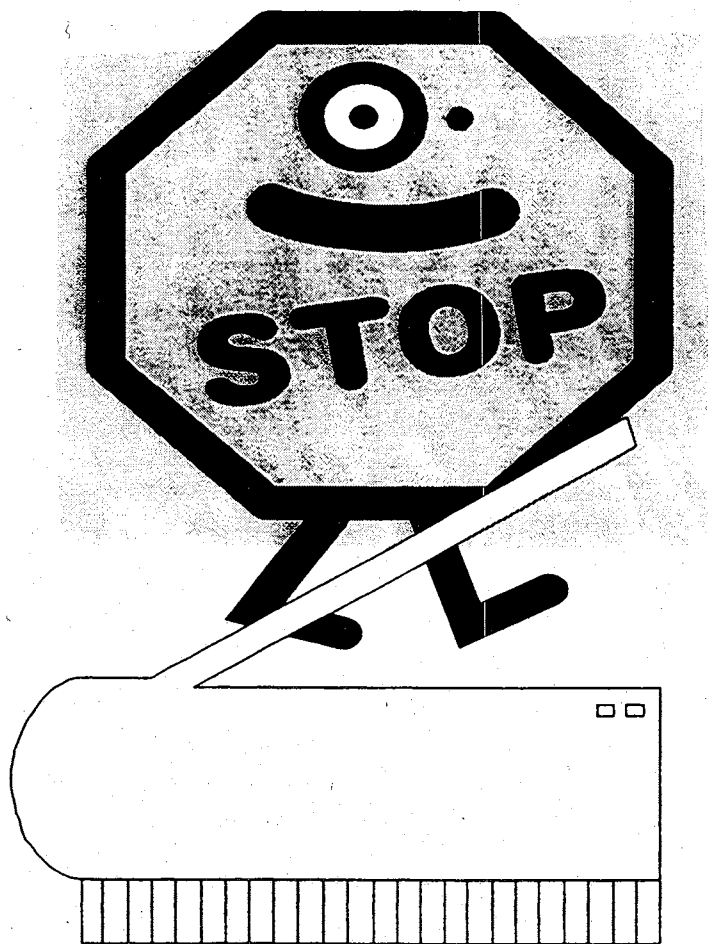

Preparations made for Fuentes sentencing hearing

SUNBURY — The Northumberland County district attorney and Fredil O. Fuentes' defense attorney met Tuesday

morning to sort out last-minute details in preparation for a week-long degree-of-guilt hearing scheduled for later this month.

Mr. Fuentes pleaded guilty in March to an open count of

homicide for the 2005 slaying of Carly Snyder, of Milton, in a deal in which prosecutors agreed not to seek the death penalty.

In the hearing beginning April 17, President Judge Rob-

ert B. Sacavage will be asked to determine if Mr. Fuentes is guilty of first-, second- or third-degree murder, or man-

slayer in the case.

Court officials have described the hearing as being much like a trial, except there won't be a jury or claim of innocence. The hearing comes in the wake of Mr. Fuentes' plea made as part of an agreement in which prosecutors gave up the right to seek the death penalty.

If the judge rules the slaying was first- or second-degree murder, then Mr. Fuentes would be faced with life in prison without any chance of parole. Third-degree murder carries a maximum jail time of 25-40 years in prison.

Mr. Fuentes, 34, was ar-

rested June 10, the same day Miss Snyder, his 20-year-old neighbor, was found stabbed to death in her 130 Upper Market St. apartment in Milton. In describing the killing at the proceeding in which Mr. Fuentes pleaded guilty, District Attorney Anthony Rosini said Miss Snyder was stabbed 37 times with several knives.

Mr. Fuentes confessed to the crime in an interview with a police officer prior to his arrest, Mr. Rosini said. Also, Miss Snyder's blood was found on Mr. Fuentes' jeans and his blood was found at the scene of the crime, Mr. Rosini said.

Among the issues agreed upon by the attorneys Tuesday was that prosecutors won't have to call witnesses to testify

about how the DNA evidence was collected.

Judge Sacavage is supposed to issue an order decreeing that any testimony provided by Dr. Han Lyvanson, a psychiatrist hired by the defense, be limited to information included in a report he has already provided unless he files a supplemental report by April 14.

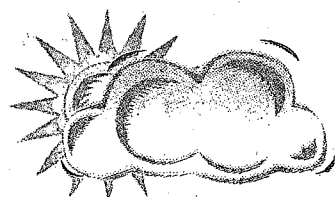
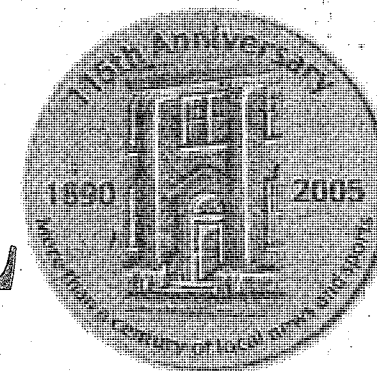

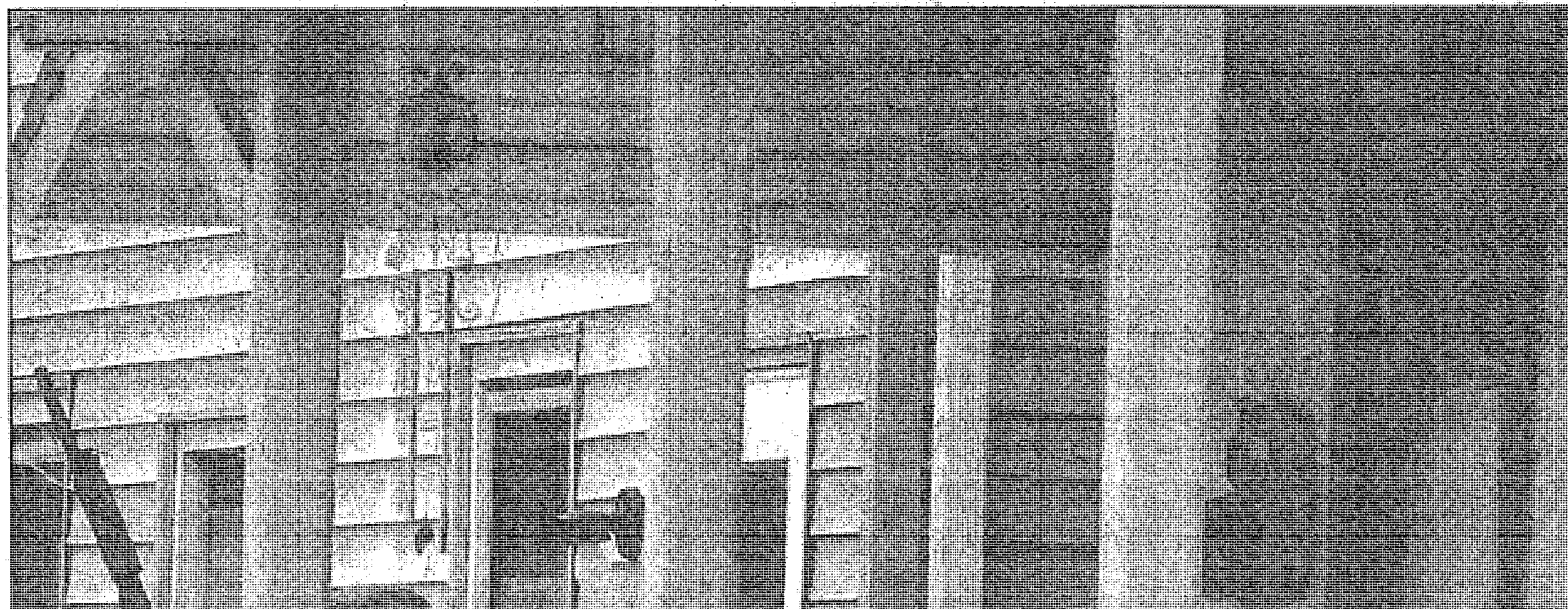
Murder in Milton

Republican leader walks out of hearing

WASHINGTON — The Republican chairman walked off with the gavel, leaving Democrats shouting into turned-off microphones at a raucous hearing Friday on the Patriot Act.

The House Judiciary Committee hearing, with the two sides accusing each other of being irresponsible and undemocratic, came as President Bush was urging Congress to renew those sections of the post-Sept. 11 counterterrorism law set to expire in September.

Rep. James Sensenbrenner, R-Wis., chairman of the panel, abruptly gavelled the meeting to an end and walked out, followed by other Republicans.

Sensenbrenner declared that much of the testimony, which veered into debate over the detainees at Guantanamo Bay, was irrele-

the floor.

After seeing this, Zettlemoyer entered the back of the building to find Snyder and discovered she'd been stabbed. Other officers began arriving on the scene, and according to State Police trooper Matt Burrows, the Milton Police Department and Pennsylvania State Police worked in cooperation to sweep the house to make sure it was safe.

Also responding were the Lewisburg and Watsonstown police departments. According to Burrows, there was one officer from both Watsonstown and Lewisburg, 12 State Police troopers and the entire MPD.

Police said upon more officers arriving, they noticed blood at the backdoor area and more in the area near Rodriguez's door. Officer in Charge from Watsonstown Dennis Derr interviewed Rodriguez and said he noticed numerous cuts on his hands and arms, cuts Rodriguez said came from work. Police said as the conversation continued, he told Derr he cut his fingers while working in his kitchen.

While Rodriguez continued to talk with Derr, police said he told them he reported to work along with his wife at 4 a.m., something police later said his wife, Bobbi Rodriguez denied, saying her husband did not go to work

Friday. After this, police took Rodriguez to the police department for further questioning.

Police said following the reading of his Miranda rights, Rodriguez gave inconsistent statements about how he got the cuts on his hands. Eventually, however, police said during the interview, Rodriguez admitted to killing Snyder. He told police about the knife that Zettlemoyer found with the victim and said he used two other knives during the assault.

As of press time, police were still not able to provide a reason for the alleged homicide.

During his arraignment, Rodriguez was told he was to be charged with criminal homicide, aggravated assault (felony one and two) and criminal trespass. District Attorney Anthony Rosini said the criminal homicide charge would be decided upon by a jury, if Rodriguez is convicted, and could be first, second or third degree, or voluntary or involuntary. If it would be found to be in the first degree, he could be sentenced to life in prison. Rosini said he would have to look further at the evidence before he made a decision about whether he would pursue the death penalty.

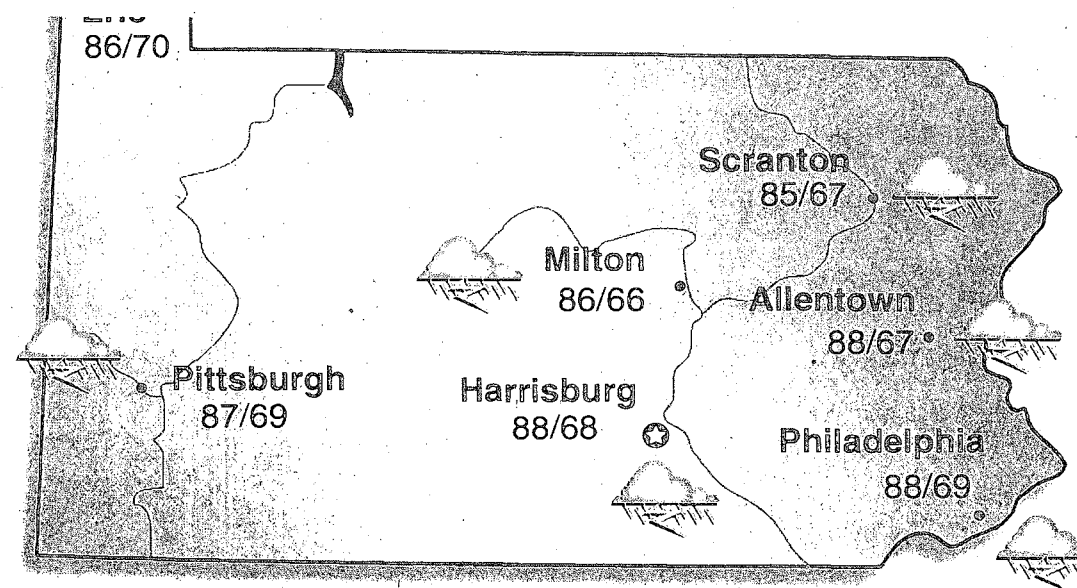
On the felony one charge, Rosini said if Rodriguez is con-

victed, the sentence would carry a maximum of 20 years in prison. The felony two charge carries a maximum of 10 years, while the criminal trespass would carry a maximum of seven years.

Kear said he would not be able to set bail because of the nature of the charges. That will be determined by Northumberland County President Judge Robert Sacavage at a hearing at 9:15 a.m. Wednesday in Sunbury. A preliminary hearing for Rodriguez will be held in front of Kear at 9 a.m. Thursday in Milton.

Officer in Charge for the Milton Police, Sergeant Craig Lucher, said that the investigation was done in a timely manner and efficiently because of the help and cooperation of Derr, State Police Sergeant John Tom, Rosini, the Lewisburg police and interpretor Oscar Guerrero-Kees, who helped discussions between police and Rodriguez. Guerrero-Kees is a guidance counselor in the Milton Area School District who volunteered to help the police department. Northumberland County Coroner James Kelly was also on the scene.

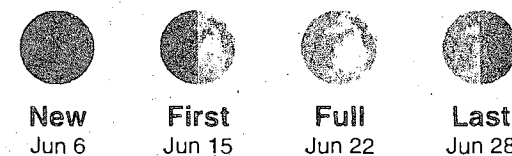
