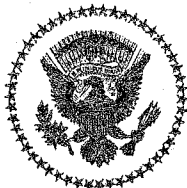

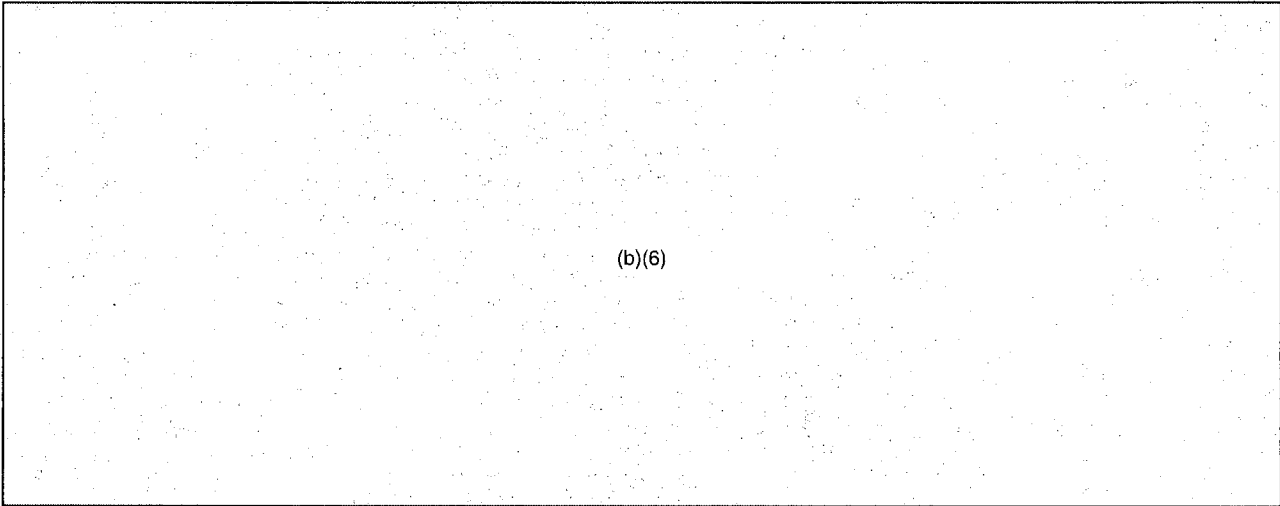

II. BACKGROUND

Dr. Mugenyi is the director of the Joint Clinical Research Center in Uganda. Through assistance from PEPFAR, Dr. Mugenyi was able to expand his Clinical Research Center that serves AIDS patients in Uganda from one to 25 sites in a single year. Today, his program has 35 sites – many of them in remote rural areas – that provide treatment to 35,000 of his countrymen. He understands first-hand the importance of your leadership on HIV/AIDS. Dr. Mugenyi sat next to Mrs. Bush at your State of the Union Address.

In June 2004, PEPFAR funds began supporting care and treatment for patients at McCord Hospital in South Africa; as a result, Thandazile Darby and her children receive lifesaving Antiretroviral Treatments (ARVs) through PEPFAR. The ARVs are administered by Dr. Helga Holst, their physician at McCord Hospital. Patients at the hospital, including the Darby family, now pay only a nominal fee for doctor visits and ARVs.

Cardinal Theodore E. McCarrick, Ph.D., D.D. Archbishop of Washington



Cardinal Theodore Edgar McCarrick, installed as Archbishop of Washington on January 3, 2001, was born in New York City on (b)(6) (b)(6) to Theodore Egan McCarrick and Margaret McLaughlin. The young McCarrick attended Catholic elementary school and later Fordham Preparatory School. He studied in Europe for a year and a half before returning to Fordham University, his mind already made up to study for the priesthood. He entered St. Joseph's Seminary, Yonkers, NY, where he earned a BA in 1954 and a Master's Degree in History in 1958. Francis Cardinal Spellman ordained him to the

priesthood on May 31, 1958 in New York City. He went on to earn a second Master's degree in Social Sciences and a Ph.D. in Sociology from The Catholic University of America, Washington, D.C.

Father McCarrick's first assignment was as assistant chaplain of Catholic University where he went on to serve as dean of students and as director of development. He was named president of the Catholic University of Puerto Rico in Ponce in 1965, where he was responsible for the intense development of the school as a major institution. That same year he received the title of monsignor from Pope Paul VI. In 1969, Terence Cardinal Cooke recalled Msgr. McCarrick to New York to serve as associate secretary for education and an assistant priest at Blessed Sacrament parish from 1969-1971 and then as the Cardinal's Secretary from 1971-1977.

In 1977, Pope Paul VI named Msgr. McCarrick Auxiliary Bishop of New York. In his years as auxiliary bishop, he served as Vicar of East Manhattan and the Harlems. Pope John Paul II appointed him to be the first Bishop of Metuchen, New Jersey when the diocese was established in 1981. From 1986 until his appointment to the Archdiocese of Washington, he served as the fourth Archbishop of Newark, New Jersey.

In 1986 and again in 1992, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) elected then-Archbishop McCarrick to head its Committee on Migration. In 1992, he also was named to head the Committee for Aid to the Church in Central and Eastern Europe, and was elected in 1996 as chair of the Committee on International Policy. He remains a member of that committee and, in November 2001, was elected Chairman of the Domestic Policy Committee. Other USCCB committees on which the Cardinal has served are Administrative, Doctrine, Laity, Latin America and the Missions. He was elected one of 15 U.S. bishops to serve as a member of the Synod for America held in 1997. At the conclusion of that

Synod, the bishops elected him to serve on the Post Synodal Council.

He is chancellor of The Catholic University of America and president of the Board of Trustees of the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. A founding member of the Papal Foundation, he has served as its president since 1997. Cardinal McCarrick also is a member of the Board of Catholic Relief Services. For the Vatican, he serves on the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace, the Pontifical Council for the Pastoral Care of Migrants and Itinerant Peoples and the Pontifical Commission for Latin America.

He has visited many nations as a human rights advocate and to survey humanitarian needs. These include China, Cuba, Vietnam, the Philippines, South Korea, Rwanda and Burundi. He has traveled extensively in Eastern Europe. In November 1996, then-Archbishop McCarrick was invited to serve on the Secretary of State's Advisory Committee on Religious Freedom Abroad and from 1999-2001, he was a member of the United States Commission for International Religious Freedom.

In January 1998, then-Archbishop McCarrick was one of three American clerics invited to visit China and discuss religious freedoms in that country. In January 2000, the President of Lebanon named him an Officer of the Order of the Cedars of Lebanon and in December 2000, the president of the United States presented him with the Eleanor Roosevelt Award for Human Rights.

On February 21, 2001, just seven weeks after he was installed as the Archbishop of Washington, Archbishop McCarrick was elevated to the College of Cardinals by Pope John Paul II. He took possession of his titular church, Ss. Nereus and Achilleus, on June 28, 2001.

Cardinal McCarrick speaks five languages: English, French, German, Italian and Spanish.

To sign into law H.R. 4145, To Direct the Joint Committee on the Library to Obtain a Statue of Rosa Parks and to Place the Statue in the United States Capitol.

II. BACKGROUND

H.R. 4145 directs the Joint Committee on the Library to place a statue of Rosa Parks in the Capitol's National Statuary Hall. The statue will be the first of an African-American woman placed in the hall. The bill signing, which falls on the 50th anniversary of the start of the Montgomery Bus Boycott, will highlight the contribution of Rosa Parks to the Civil Rights Movement.

The bill passed the House of Representatives on November 17, 2005, by voice vote. It passed the Senate on November 18, 2005, by unanimous consent. Congressman Jesse Jackson, Jr. (D, IL-02) is the lead House sponsor and Senator John Kerry (D, MA) is the lead Senate sponsor.
