A Plea To The President

Today's Washington Post featured a disturbing front-page story quoting numerous unnamed White House officials - all of them critical of Israel. Even more disturbing, Secretary of State Powell, in Madrid yesterday, said the following, "I think we are all in agreement and the world is in agreement that the solution will not be produced by terror or a response to terror." With that one sentence Powell abandoned moral clarity and embraced the moral relativists who see no difference between terrorism and fighting terrorism. He also seemed to question our war against Al-Qaeda and the Taliban in Afghanistan. Our war effort in Afghanistan is, after all, a "response to terror."

Friends in Israel are calling on us to say they feel abandoned. My phone has been ringing off the hook with calls from conservative and Christian leaders wanting to "do something." So, we quickly put together a letter to the President praising him for his strong leadership in the war against terrorism, but urging him to support Israel - because Israel is fighting the same war we are fighting in Afghanistan, just on a different front. A number of Evangelical leaders signed the letter and many more would have signed if we had the time.

I will be on Fox Morning News tomorrow morning at 8:50 ET to discuss the

letter. A copy of the letter has been included for your review. These are dangerous times for America and for all of Western civilization. I will continue to stand firmly with our ally, Israel, and will proudly speak out on behalf of Israel's right to self-defense. As always, I welcome your comments - whatever they may be.

Dear President Bush:

We, the undersigned, wish to take this opportunity to commend you for the enlightened leadership you have provided in the global war against terrorism, and your efforts to bring peace to the Middle East.

We also wish to express our support for the Bush Doctrine - your moral conviction that terrorism can never be justified no matter the cause or grievance. As you have repeatedly made clear those who intentionally slaughter non-combatants for political purposes are at war with the United States and with the entire civilized world.

It is because we so strongly support the moral case you have made against terrorism that we write you today with heavy hearts. We believe the Bush Doctrine is in great jeopardy and the war on terrorism with it. We believe it is imperative for the United States to stand with our friend and ally Israel as they attempt to defeat the same forces of terrorism that we have been battling since September 11, 2001. We would ask you to end the pressure on Israeli Prime Minister Ariel Sharon so that he has the time necessary to complete the mission he has undertaken - the elimination of terrorist cells and infrastructure from the West Bank territories.

Prime Minister Sharon has made clear that he intends to keep troops in the West Bank no longer than absolutely necessary. But, as he has also made clear, to leave armed and dangerous terrorists at large among the general Palestinian population would not facilitate the cause of peace. Indeed, such terrorists pose an unacceptable threat not only to innocent Israeli civilians, but also to those Palestinians who sincerely seek a way out of the current conflict. If suicide bombings prevail in the Middle East surely America will see such attacks on our own families and communities.

No one knows what tomorrow will bring in the Middle East, but we can determine what Israel's brief offensive has accomplished so far: Five bomb-making facilities have been discovered and destroyed, including 17 bombs that were ready to be used. In addition, documentary evidence was discovered in the offices of Yassir Arafat, evidence showing that he personally approves and finances bombings and other terrorist activities.

Given these revelations, it seems to us that Secretary Powell's current peace-making trip is sending a dangerous message. The focus of the trip appears to be more pressure on Israel to withdraw without any commitment by Arab nations to control the terrorists dedicated to Israel's destruction. And we are pressuring Israel to negotiate with Arafat in spite of his complicity in promoting terror. Both of these outcomes violate your well-articulated anti-terror doctrine.

Mr. President, under your leadership the civilized world is making great progress in the global war against terrorism. Israel is finally making progress on the Middle Eastern front in this war.

Israel is America's reliable - and valuable - ally. We urge you to continue to provide Israel the support it deserves.

Washington Times (4/11/02):

Sen. Charles E. Schumer, New York Democrat, said the accusations "don't pass the laugh test." He said the remarks "were absurd, laughable, and demeaning to our process." "It is a smoke screen and a diversion, and it will not work. We will not be stampeded or bamboozled by the cheap-shot argument made today," he said.

Democrats are concerned that Mr. Estrada's views are "way out of the mainstream." Mr. Schumer said he questioned Mr. Estrada's stances on civil rights and abortion. Mr. Estrada will get a hearing and a vote sometime this year, but Mr. Schumer could not provide a specific month. Mr. Schumer said he is still studying Mr. Estrada's record and has not decided whether he will vote for him.

Sen. Charles E. Schumer (D-N.Y.) said Estrada would not get favorable treatment simply because he is a Latino. "I don't care if a nominee is white, black, Latino or anything," he said. "If they are in the mold of Scalia and Thomas, I'm not going to be stampeded into voting for them."

AP Online (4/11/02)

Sen. Charles Schumer, D-N.Y., called the discrimination complaint "absurd, laughable and also demeaning." "I don't care if a judge nominee is white, black, Latino or something else, if they are in the mold of Justices (Antonin) Scalia and Thomas, I am not going to be stampeded into voting for them," he said. . . . "I think it sort of clouds the argument that we ought to do these quickly when they took their sweet time back then," Schumer said.

CAMERON: On the Hill, when reporters mentioned delays to Schumer, he acknowledged inaction. But a Democratic staffer contradicted the senator when he began to say all the nominees would soon have their hearings.

SCHUMER: Correct. And they all will this year. Doesn't that -- No, sorry, nope. Mr. Estrada will get his hearing.



I would now like to introduce Percy Anderson. He is joined by several members of his family at today's hearing including his brother Jerry Anderson, his nephew Caulin Anderson, Vivian Murphy, and Tonia Murphy. I extend our Committee's welcome to all of you.

Mr. Anderson, a resident of Inglewood, California, has spent his entire 25-year legal career practicing law in Southern California.

After graduating from UCLA law school, Mr. Anderson spent three years working for San Fernando Valley Neighborhood Legal Services before joining the criminal division of the United States Attorney's Office in Los Angeles.



**STATEMENT OF U.S. SENATOR BARBARA BOXER

CALIFORNIA: PERCY ANDERSON AND JOHN F. WALTER**

Mr. Chairman, Senator Hatch, and members of the Senate Committee on the Judiciary, I am pleased to offer my support for the two nominees for the Central District Court of California before you today -- John F. Walter and Percy Anderson. Both are very well regarded by those who know them and their work. I am confident that, should they be confirmed, they will discharge their responsibilities ably, with dignity, integrity and intelligence.

I also want to comment on the process that brought these two accomplished individuals before you today. In a truly bipartisan fashion, the White House Counsel, Senator Feinstein and I worked together to create four judicial advisory committees for the State of California, one in each federal judicial district in the state. Mr. Anderson continued his public service as a federal prosecutor handling numerous grand jury investigations and criminal prosecutions, as well as supervising other attorneys in the criminal division. He went on to private practice, specializing in a variety of areas of civil litigation, including trial and appellate work. He has tried cases before state and federal courts, including the United States Supreme Court.

Mr. Anderson has an exemplary record and is well-respected. The Central District will benefit greatly from his service, and I strongly support his nomination and quick confirmation.

Mr. Walter also brings a wealth of experience to the federal bench. He also has served as a federal prosecutor and a civil litigator and has tried cases before the California State Supreme Court and the United States Supreme Court, before the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals and in the Central District where he has been nominated to serve.

Please find following an article on the April 12 Forward by Debbie Jonas on her family's time in Israel over the recent Passover holiday. Debbie and her husband Howard are friends of longstanding. I commend to your attention points raised in her article that do not seem to be raised by journalists as they comment on the current phase of this conflict of 54 years.

Am also sending a memo just sent to Tim Russert.

Against the reports of widespread criticism of Israel there is, I believe, willingness by others to suggest that the conflict has continued because the Arab belligerents would not let the battlefield determine and end of the conflict as leading to peace settlement.

My sense is that the current reports of anti-Israel feeling suggest that the Arabs relied on the undertone of anti-Semitism among observers to shield them from the diplomatic consequences that usually follow military defeat.

And the Arabs seem to have been successful in this regard -- else the views of Clark Clifford and James G. McDonald might have prevailed in 1948 and the conflict would long since have ended.

Clifford thought our appeasement of the Arabs was not helpful to U.S. prestige and McDonald suggested that matters will not get better if we let Arab leaders "call the tune."

The call on Israel, recently, to withdraw "without delay" was, I think, the comment expected from, say, Secretary Baker in 1991. Israel, the record suggests, seems to learn from unproductive responses to pressure. Perhaps a statement might note that the Arab side must deal with the consequences of violence against Israel and not expect world opinion will deliver Israel when those consequences are contrary to Arab goals.

Three years ago, almost to the day, The Washington Post announced, in its lead story, April 6, 1999,

Skies Clear, NATO Rains Bombs;
Clinton Vows Relentless Attack

The paper was informing readers of the air campaign against Yugoslavia that, quoting President Clinton, would be "unceasing and unrelenting" until President Slobodan Milosevic reverses course in Kosovo."

I am not aware that much notice was given, by our media, to the impact of this air campaign on Yugoslav civilians.

I heard National Security Adviser Condoleezza Rice state, on Meet the Press, this morning, that the Middle East problem, today, will not be solved "by military power alone." We seem to have relied a good deal on military power in Yugoslavia, three years ago, military power in the form of airstrikes that, from time to time, gave rise to expressions of regret for "collateral damage."

Of course, the Second World War saw us rely on military power, alone, to solve that problem. I don't think Churchill and FDR would much have been interested in a peace process with Hitler.

Perhaps indications of Arab moderation are heard when plans are offered that would recognize Israel's right to exist. But these indications also support, I submit, the argument that the aim of belligerency against Israel is the destruction of the Jewish State. Please note that our reliance on military power against Germany did not destroy the German state -- although Germany's surrender did result in boundary changes that I do not believe were since termed inadmissible as the result of force.

The adage that war is diplomacy by other means has, I think, been changed, in the Middle East to diplomacy being war by other means -- and from the day that Israel first defended her existence against Arab attack that sought a result based on military force: the end of Israel.

City of Wondering

It rained almost continuously after our arrival in Jerusalem two weeks ago, and that is the good news. The rain made it possible to offer another explanation for the emptiness of the streets. When we went to the Western Wall and found only a handful of people, I blamed the rain.

It is easy, sitting in Jerusalem on vacation, to feel like you are losing your mind, like you see things that no one else sees.

I wonder whether I am the only American to have ever looked at a map of Israel, and noticed that the Palestinian population centers are smack in the middle of the country.

The West Bank is not some conveniently isolated little parcel of land that can be easily and surgically separated from Israel. When Israelis fear that the Palestinians want to push them into the sea, it's not hyperbole; the border of the new Palestinian state would be only 14 short kilometers from the Mediterranean Sea.

Am I the only American who has ever wondered why, when hundreds of Israeli army ranks capable of massive destruction rumble into Ramallah, there are so few Palestinian casualties?

Am I the only one who wonders

why the death of five Palestinian policemen in Ramallah is big news, but the cold blooded killing of 11 Palestinian "collaborators" by fellow Palestinians is barely noted, even when their bodies are hacked up and dragged through the streets?

Am I the only one who wonders whether President Bush would treat Osama Bin Laden with the same kid gloves with which Prime Minister Sharon is forced to treat Yasser Arafat, if the situation were reversed and it were Bin Laden holed up, "isolated" in his compound, giving candlelight interviews to CNN?

I wonder whether I am the only one who realizes that the Palestinian suicide bombings are not the result of occupation, but rather the failed attempt to end that occupation with the Oslo accords. The Palestinian Authority is largely an Israeli creation, a Frankenstein of huge proportions.

Nablus, Jenin, Tulkarm, Qalqilya and Bethlehem are all cities over which Arafat had autonomy. Had he proven his trustworthiness, he would already have his state. Had he been willing to negotiate at Camp David, rather than storm our like a petulant child, he would have his state.

Instead he used his autonomous cities, his fledgling state, to wreak havoc on Israeli civilians, to make bombs and import weapons. Today the Israeli army has to use all its might to reoccupy cities that, prior to Oslo, were under its control. It has to dismantle the authority that it helped to create.

It is not occupation that is causing Secretary of State Colin Powell to travel to Jerusalem, but re-occupation of territory that should never have been put into Arafat's bloody hands in the first place. It is what Thomas Friedman so aptly called the "narcissistic rage" of the Palestinians that is going to give Powell, Gen. Anthony Zinni and even Dan Rather a case of jet lag, as well as a lot of gray hair.

I'm not a right-wing lunatic or a religious fanatic, just an American who can't help but see things for what they are. September 11 happens here every day, piecemeal, chipping away at everyone's sanity, making every trip to the market for a quart of milk feel like a game of Russian roulette.

On Tuesday we returned to New York. I'm sure my 8-year-old daughter, the sweetest, gentlest kid on the planet, will stop having nightmares, and my 5-year-old twins will stop asking if we're going to get bombed every time we go for pizza, and my 10-year-old son the math whiz will stop figuring our odds of getting blown up at any given time of day. My 13-year-old daughter, who begged to be allowed to shop in Israel, will be able to go to the mall, and my only fear will be the damage to my credit card. I'll be able to sleep at night.

And my friend in Tel Aviv, whose husband got called up to the reserves last week, and is now somewhere in or near Nablus, part of that big, bad, aggressive occupying force that I keep hearing about, will sit and cry and rub her pregnant belly, and wonder whether the man she waited her whole life for is going to come home, and when.

She and thousands of women like her, and the whole country, in fact, are just as isolated as Arafat, but unlike him, no one is warching them to make sure that they emerge unscathed.

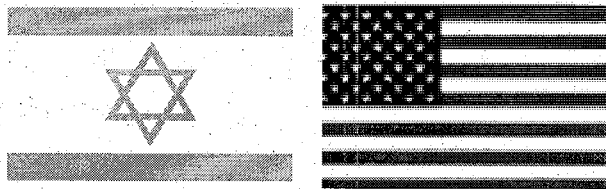
