I. PURPOSE

To speak to a broad coalition of charities and faith leaders that support the CARE Act, highlighting the need for quick action on this bill, as promised by Senator Daschle.

II. BACKGROUND

The CARE Act was drafted by Senators Lieberman and Santorum, in close consultation with White House staff. It is a bipartisan, consensus bill that closely reflects your principles on the Armies of Compassion initiative and has 15 co-sponsors ranging from Senator Brownback (R-KS) to Senator Clinton (D-NY). The legislation features three main sections:

(1) Programs aimed at increasing charitable giving through tax incentives:

- Allows an estimated 84 million taxpayers who do not itemize to deduct up to \$400 (\$800 for joint filers) of their charitable contributions;
- Allows individuals to make tax-free distributions from their IRAs to charities; and
- Provides enhanced deductions for farmers and restaurants to donate food to food banks.

(2) Equal treatment for faith-based organizations:

- Ends practice of discriminating against faith-based organizations because of religious iconography, governance, or experience with government contracts;
- Creates a 501(c)3 "EZ Pass" process to help small, community-based groups get tax-deductible status more easily; and
- Establishes a \$150 million Compassion Capital Fund to assist and educate faith-based and community organizations and provide technical assistance in the Federal grants process for such organizations to small church start-ups.

(3) Federal funding to provide immediate relief to vulnerable groups:

- Provides an additional \$275 million in FY03 for the Social Service Block Grant (SSBG) that supports efforts such as Meals on Wheels; and
- Provides \$33 million in FY03 for maternity group homes, principally for teenage unwed mothers.

As you know, H.R. 7 (sponsored by Congressmen J.C. Watts and Tony Hall) includes many of these provisions and passed the House in July by a vote of 233-189. The Senate legislation steers clear, however, of the contentious civil rights issues that surrounded the House debate over the so-called "charitable choice" provisions.

Last year, Senator Daschle promised you floor time for your faith-based initiative and has written an op-ed in support of the CARE Act in which he said, "The CARE Act isn't a Republican or a Democratic plan. It is a bipartisan proposal that strikes the right balance between harnessing the best forces of faith in our public life without infringing on the First Amendment. ... Most importantly, it is representative of what we can accomplish in Washington when we put partisanship and politics aside and focus on what matters. I look forward to working with President Bush to get this proposal signed into law."

In your remarks, you will ask the Congress to send the faith-based legislation to you by Memorial Day. The Senate Finance Committee is expected to mark up the CARE Act the last week in April, enabling it to move quickly to the Senate floor.

Remarks on Meeting with Charity and Faith Leaders

April 11, 2002

All of you here today have answered a great call – to love your neighbor as you'd like to be loved yourselves. You are giving help to women in crisis ... and hope to prisoners ... and guidance to troubled children ... and food and shelter to the homeless. I am here today to thank you for your good work, and to urge Congress to take your side ... to support your efforts ... and to help make our Nation a more generous and compassionate place.

- The events of September 11th were a dark moment in our history – yet in that moment, our national character shined brightly. Heroes risked their lives to save others, and ordinary Americans responded with tremendous generosity. Americans prayed, and grieved, and gave. Relief organizations received more than two billion dollars. The goodness of America overcame a terrible evil.
- The past seven months have proven how much our country depends on charities. Yet many of America's charities are facing difficult times. Because of the recession and the impact of September 11th, many charities not directly involved in the relief effort have seen their donations fall.
 - For example, America's Second Harvest – the country's largest hunger-relief charity – reports that more than eighty percent of its affiliates face increased demands for food, while about forty percent have seen a significant drop in food donations and funding.

- In northern California, the United Way is facing an unprecedented fund-raising shortfall for 2001. Giving was fourteen percent below the year before. The group's leader said, "I don't think we've ever had a drop-off of this magnitude. It affects our ability to serve our community."
- And the United Way in Orlando, Florida was forced to lay off seventeen percent of its staff in February because it fell significantly short of its fund-raising goal.
- Many of the charities represented in this room are confronting greater needs with fewer resources. You need and deserve our help.
- Americans should respond, in the generous spirit that defines our country. Our Nation is still recovering from terrorist attacks. Yet we also have continuing needs in every community. And I hope Americans will learn about those needs, and meet them.
- Government also has a role to play and responsibilities to meet. We must find ways to help the inspired and the effective ... to rally the armies of compassion ... to support the essential work of charities, without changing their nature. Our government can promote more private sector giving ... and ensure that faith-based charities aren't being discriminated against as they seek to serve.
- The Charity Aid, Recovery, and Empowerment Act – what we call the CARE Act – will meet these goals. Senators Joe Lieberman and Rick Santorum have done an outstanding job on this bill. And their work builds on the excellent work of Congressman J.C. Watts, Congressman Tony Hall, and the House leadership, who have already passed faith-based legislation.
- The CARE Act will allow those who do not itemize deductions on their tax returns to deduct their charitable contributions. Right now, people are preparing to file their income tax returns – but nearly eighty-four million Americans cannot deduct their gifts to charity because they don't itemize. We should reward and encourage giving by everyone in our society, not just the wealthy.

- The CARE Act also will create a more level playing field for faith-based and community organizations when it comes to government funding. We must end discrimination against faith groups, just because they have a rabbi on their board, a cross on the wall, or a mission statement inspired by their faith.
- I appreciate what Senator Daschle said about the CARE Act. He said, "The CARE Act isn't a Republican or a Democratic plan. It is a bipartisan proposal that strikes the right balance between harnessing the best forces of faith in our public life without infringing on the First Amendment."
- Charities in this country need the help this Act will provide. And the people who rely on these charities need the help this Act will provide. Every day that passes without this legislation is another day that the charity crisis is ignored and people suffer. I hope the Senate will pass the CARE Act by early May, and the Congress will send me a bill to sign by Memorial Day. Let's get it done and give America's helpers and healers the tools they need to care for neighbors in need.
