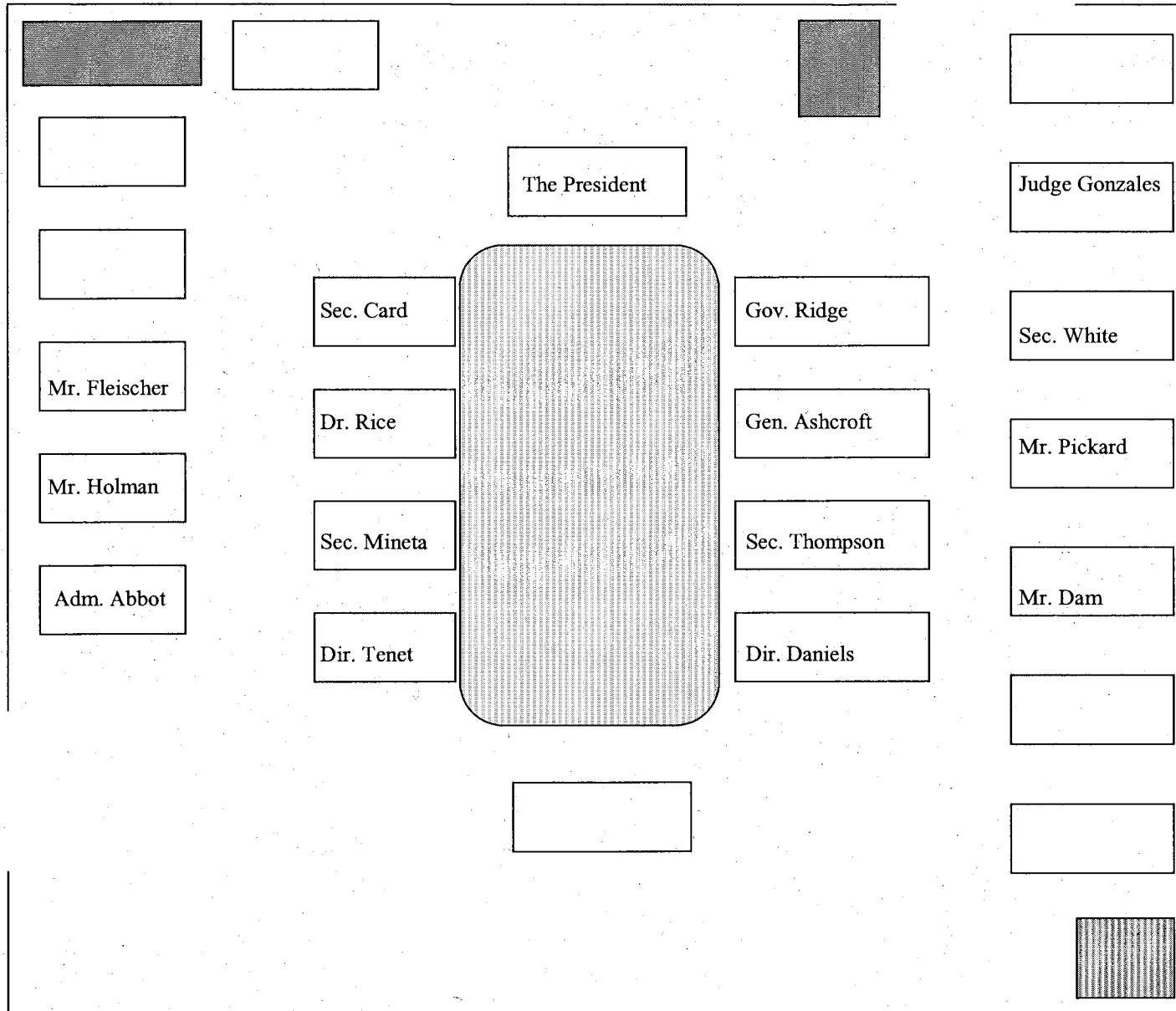

I. PURPOSE

Provides an opportunity for you to: (1) highlight the importance of supporting charities of all kinds during the "season of giving"; (2) call on Congress to enact your Armies of Compassion legislation to support charitable organizations and encourage more charitable giving; and (3) announce over \$1 billion in HUD grants to support local non-profit organizations that assist the homeless.

II. BACKGROUND

So Others Might Eat (SOME) is an inter-faith organization run by community-based volunteers. It was founded by a local group of priests and ministers in 1970 as a soup kitchen. Breakfast and lunch are served 7 days a week, averaging 1200 meals a day, and the organization served more than 300,000 meals during 2000. Today, food is only one of the direct services provided by the organization. Since its opening, SOME has expanded its services and now operates 15 programs that serve the homeless population. These programs include other direct services (medical, clothing, showers); rehabilitative programs (job training, substance abuse counseling); permanent housing; elderly services; and organization of the community.

Policy

Your visit provides you with an opportunity to call on Americans to support traditional charities during the "Season of Giving." Many social service charities ranging from Habitat for Humanity to SOME have reported decreased contributions in the wake of the September 11 attacks. This is the result of the economic downturn, the siphoning of funds to September 11-related efforts, and from the anthrax attacks, which hindered some direct mail efforts.

Your visit also provides an opportunity to promote your Armies of Compassion legislation. That legislation features three main sections:

(1) Programs aimed at increasing charitable giving through tax incentives.

- Allow an estimated 84 million taxpayers who do not itemize to deduct their charitable contributions;
- Allow individuals to make tax-free distributions from their IRAs to charities; and
- Provide enhanced deductions for farmers and restaurants to donate food for food banks.

(2) Equal treatment for all non-governmental organizations – sacred or secular.

- Require non-discrimination against non-governmental organizations based on religious grounds, including religious iconography, governance, and experience with government contracts;
- Create a 501(c)3 “EZ Pass” process to help small, community-based groups get tax-deductible status more easily; and
- Establish a \$135 million Compassion Capital Fund to educate and empower community-based organizations.

(3) Other initiatives supporting vulnerable populations.

- Mentoring for children of prisoners; and
- Maternity group homes, principally for teenage unwed mothers.

As you know, H.R. 7 (sponsored by Congressmen J.C. Watts and Tony Hall) includes many of these provisions and passed the House in July by a vote of 233-189. Senators Joe Lieberman and Rick Santorum will introduce a broadly-supported, bipartisan, consensus bill next week (avoiding the divisive civil rights issues). You sent the attached letter to Senate leaders last week, and we are working with the Senate and House on this consensus package.

Finally, SOME is being awarded \$938,947 this year through a grant from the Department of Housing and Urban Development for one year to fund operations and services. These grants are part of more than \$1 billion that HUD will announce concurrently through its Continuum of Care and Emergency Shelter Grant programs. These programs support organizations that provide housing and supportive services to hundreds of thousands of homeless families and individuals.

#### Event

You will visit the dining room at SOME's O Street location, where you will meet volunteers who are preparing lunch. Groups and individuals volunteer to prepare and serve food for the homeless. The audience for your remarks will consist of a representative group of volunteers from other SOME locations and key volunteer organizers.

Remarks on Charitable Giving at *So Others Might Eat*  
November 20, 2001

I'm happy to be here with Father Adams and the volunteers at *So Others Might Eat*. Over the years, Protestants, Catholics, Jews, Muslims, Sikhs, and Hindus have volunteered with Father Adams to help their neighbors in need. These good people are deeply thankful for the blessings they have received – and they are helping to share our blessings with those who are in need.

Since September 11<sup>th</sup>, America's charities have stood by America. In this season of giving, it is time for America to stand by her charities. They are meeting critical needs in communities across our country.

- This Nation was deeply wounded just 10 weeks ago – but America is in many ways stronger than we were. In this Thanksgiving season, we have a tremendous amount to be thankful for: our Nation and its freedoms; our military strength and material wealth; the character of our people and the care of God.
- After the September 11<sup>th</sup> terrorist attacks we saw the best of America – particularly a tremendous outpouring of giving. Relief organizations received more than one billion dollars from concerned citizens.
- But many charities not directly involved in the relief effort have seen their donations fall. This is understandable – but it is also unfortunate. There are many human needs that still must be met. Food banks are receiving fewer contributions. Mentoring and adult literacy programs are reporting fewer volunteers. The demands on many charities are growing – but their resources are dwindling.
- Government has a role to play and responsibilities to meet. Today, I am pleased to announce that the Department of Housing and Urban Development is distributing more than one billion dollars in grants to community charities serving the homeless. These programs provide



food, shelter, counseling, drug treatment, job training, and many other vital services to neighbors in need.

- Government must also promote more private sector giving, provide for equal treatment of non-governmental organizations, and support those in need. In the past several weeks, Senators Joe Lieberman and Rick Santorum have worked tirelessly to craft an "Armies of Compassion" Initiative to do just that. Their work builds on the excellent work undertaken earlier this year by Congressman J.C. Watts, Congressman Tony Hall, and the House leadership. This "Armies of Compassion" Initiative addresses immediate needs – and it is a priority. I urge Members of both houses to deliver a final bill by year's end.
- This legislation includes provisions that will allow people to donate to charitable efforts from their Individual Retirement Accounts. It allows non-itemizers to deduct charitable contributions from their taxes. It offers a food donation tax incentive to encourage giving to programs like *So Others Might Eat*. It creates a Compassion Capital Fund that will give community-based organizations needed resources and training. And through this legislation, we will simplify the process by which community-based organizations gain tax-exempt status.
- The "Armies of Compassion" Initiative helps level the playing field so that small, grassroots organizations – both sacred and secular – can compete for social service funds. And it provides support to Americans in need, such as the more than two million children with a mom or dad in prison.
- During this season of giving I ask all Americans to dig a little deeper – if you can – and help the organizations that are helping our neighbors. I also invite Americans to visit the web site of the Corporation for National and Community Service – [www.NationalService.org](http://www.NationalService.org) – to find out how to volunteer your time and your talents to help local charities.


Since September 11, Americans have come together to help meet our national needs in this time of great crisis. They have given more than \$1 billion to disaster relief efforts and many Americans have volunteered their time. Although individual generosity is evident everywhere, thousands of our Nation's charities, paradoxically, have been suffering. Donations to organizations not directly involved in disaster relief have declined dramatically. Soup kitchens are low on food. Mentoring programs for needy children are low on dollars. America's charities have stood by America -- it is now time for America to stand by her charities, as they suffer from the economic consequences of September 11.

I believe the Congress must address these issues now. We must pass and sign into law an "Armies of Compassion" bill this year that encourages and supports charitable giving, removes unneeded barriers to government support for community and faith-based groups, and authorizes important initiatives to help those in need. The House of Representatives has already advanced key elements of this agenda, and Senators Santorum and Lieberman have made great strides on consensus legislation. I believe the Congress needs to come together before recess to consider a bill that would:

- Provide incentives for charitable giving, such as the non-itemizers deduction for charitable contributions, tax-free distributions from IRAs, the charitable deduction for contributions of food, and Individual Development Accounts (IDAs) to help low-income individuals save money;
- Provide for equal treatment of community and faith-based charities, an expedited process for grassroots groups to become 501(c)(3) organizations, and a Compassion Capital Fund to provide technical assistance and capacity building for community and faith-based groups; and
- Provide support to populations in need, such as the more than 2 million children with a parent in prison.

As you know, there is strong bipartisan support for these important measures. I hope that the Senate will find time to take up and pass these provisions before the Congress adjourns this year.

**DEDICATION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE BUILDING  
IN HONOR OF ROBERT F. KENNEDY**

I. PURPOSE

To name the Department of Justice main building in honor of Robert F. Kennedy.

II. BACKGROUND

Tuesday (today) would have been Robert F. Kennedy's 76<sup>th</sup> birthday.

Robert Francis Kennedy was born on November 20, 1925, in Brookline, Massachusetts, the seventh child of Rose and Joseph P. Kennedy. He attended Milton Academy and, after wartime service in the Navy, received his degree in government from Harvard University in 1948. He earned his law degree from the University of Virginia Law School three years later.

In 1950, Robert Kennedy married Ethel Skakel of Greenwich, Connecticut, daughter of Ann Brannack Skakel and George Skakel, founder of Great Lakes Carbon Corporation. Robert and Ethel Kennedy later had eleven children. In 1952, he made his political debut as manager of his older brother John's successful campaign for the U.S. Senate from Massachusetts. The following year, he served briefly on the staff of the Senate Subcommittee on Investigations, chaired by Senator Joseph McCarthy. Kennedy's investigative work confirmed reports that countries allied with the United States against Communist China in the Korean War were also shipping goods to Communist China.

Disturbed by McCarthy's controversial tactics, Kennedy resigned from the staff after six months. He later returned to the Senate Subcommittee on Investigations as chief counsel for the Democratic minority, writing a report condemning McCarthy's investigation of alleged Communists in the Army. His later work as chief counsel for the Senate Rackets Committee investigating corruption in trade unions won him national recognition for his investigations of Teamsters Union leaders Jimmy Hoffa and David Beck.

In 1960 he managed John F. Kennedy's presidential campaign. After the election, he was appointed Attorney General.



Attorney General Kennedy launched a successful drive against organized crime - convictions against organized crime figures rose by 800% during his tenure - and became increasingly committed to the rights of African Americans to vote, attend school, and use public accommodations. He demonstrated his commitment to civil rights during a 1961 speech at the University of Georgia Law School: "We will not stand by or be aloof. We will move. I happen to believe that the 1954 [Supreme Court school desegregation] decision was right. But my belief does not matter. It is the law. Some of you may believe the decision was wrong. That does not matter. It is the law."

In September 1962, Attorney General Kennedy sent U.S. Marshals and troops to Oxford, Mississippi to enforce a Federal court order admitting the first African American student - James Meredith - to the University of Mississippi. The riot that followed Meredith's registration at "Ole Miss" left two dead and hundreds injured. Robert Kennedy saw voting as the key to racial justice and collaborated with President Kennedy when he proposed the most far-reaching civil rights statute since Reconstruction. The Civil Rights Act of 1964 passed after President Kennedy was slain.

Soon after President Kennedy's death, Robert Kennedy resigned as Attorney General and, in 1964, ran successfully for the United States Senate from New York. He then ran for the Democrat nomination for President in 1968 and was shot and died at the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles on June 5, 1968.

Prior to attending the event at the Department of Justice, the Robert F. Kennedy family will present the annual 2001 RFK Human Rights Award to Brazilian Darci Frigo. Darci Frigo is described as a passionate defender of the poor and the landless in Brazil. He is an attorney and human rights advocate with the Pastoral Land Commission, an ecumenical arm of the social ministry of the National Conference of Brazilian Bishops. In addition, they will make their annual visit to his gravesite at Arlington Cemetery.

Thank you very much, Joe. Mrs. Kennedy, Senator Ted Kennedy, and other members of the family ... Attorney General Ashcroft, former Attorneys General Barr, Thornburgh, Meese, and Katzenbach ... Administrator Perry, Director Mueller, Judge Sessions, Judge Webster, Members of Congress, ladies and gentlemen: I'm pleased to join with you in giving this building a great American name.

Seventy-nine Americans have held the title of attorney general, and twenty-five of them have worked in this building. But in the history of this department, and in the memory of our country, we hold a special place for Robert Francis Kennedy.

He first worked here not forty years ago, but fifty years ago. He was just out of the University of Virginia Law School, reporting here every morning as an attorney in the criminal division. He was 26, married, and the father of one – a baby girl who is today lieutenant governor of the state of Maryland. Ahead of him were many more accomplishments – and a few more children, too. And I know that he would look on his sons and daughters today with pride beyond measure.

America first saw him, and heard his voice, in the mid-1950s, when he was minority counsel to a Senate committee investigating organized crime. There was something about him that no one could miss – an intense, intelligent presence, and a voice that could quiet the room. As a friend has remembered him, Robert Kennedy “was not a hard man, but he was a tough man. He valued bluntness, precision, and truth.” Those under investigation surely feared him for the same qualities.

In the eyes of John F. Kennedy, no man ever had a more faithful brother. During his presidential campaign he said, “I don't know what Bobby does, but it always seems to turn out right.” We are told that after the election, the younger brother wasn't sure he should join the Cabinet – and said so to the president-elect. Robert tried to make the case, explaining why he should not become attorney general. There was no reply. The president-elect simply left the room, and casually returned a few minutes later to say, “So that's it. General, let's go.”

To this day, visitors to the West Wing, seeing the Rose Garden and colonnade, instantly think of the pictures everyone remembers of the two of them together. And from this day – his birthday – everyone who enters this building, or passes by, will think of Robert F. Kennedy, and of what he still means to our country.

He was not our longest-serving attorney general. Yet none is more fondly remembered, and few have filled their time here with so much energy, or seen events of such consequence. He was at his brother's side during the thirteen days in October 1962, calm and discerning when it mattered most. In this building he set to work on what would become the Civil Rights Act of 1964. Here he gave the order sending five hundred U.S. marshals to protect the Freedom Riders. He stood for racial desegregation. And to those on the other side of the issue he said, "My belief does not matter. It is the law. Some of you may believe the decision was wrong. That does not matter. It is the law."

With us today are some of the men who worked for our sixty-fourth attorney general, each of whom counts it the experience of a lifetime. They still look up to him. Time has done nothing to weaken their loyalty to the valiant and idealistic man they knew and followed. Robert Kennedy was a serious man, concerned with serious things. He was a strong man who understood weakness; a man who knew privilege, but also suffering. He fought to gain power, and chose to use it in the defense of the powerless. To millions who never knew him, he is still an example of kindness and courage. America today is passing through a time of testing. At such a moment we admire even more the spirit of Robert Kennedy – a spirit that tolerates no injustice, and fears no evil.

That is how his country sees him. But today, and every November 20<sup>th</sup>, a large and loving family thinks of the Dad they miss. Some of you know your way around this building, because he often brought you here. What is today the attorney general's conference room, was then his office – and your playroom and art gallery. And as the photos displayed here make clear, he also enjoyed my own favorite perk of high office: you get to bring your dog to work.

Of all that he left behind, nothing brings Robert Kennedy more clearly to mind than his good wife. In the first year of their marriage, he recorded

his feelings by quoting the Book of Ruth: "Whither thou goest I will go ... and we will be together forever." For thirty-three years, Ethel Kennedy has walked with grace and dignity, faithful to God and to the memory of her husband. Any tribute to Robert Kennedy must also be a tribute to Mrs. Robert Kennedy. She shares in all of his achievements. She has added many of her own. And today, Mrs. Kennedy, America honors you as well.

This great building, and all who work here, serve the public in the cause of justice. It now bears the name of a good and decent man, truly devoted to justice. On behalf of the people of the United States, I proudly dedicate the Robert F. Kennedy Department of Justice Building.

SUBJECT: Naming of the Robert F. Kennedy  
Department of Justice Building

Today we mark the 76th anniversary of the birth of Robert F. Kennedy, who served this Nation with great distinction in the United States Navy, as a respected attorney, as a United States Senator, and as our 64th Attorney General. As Attorney General, Robert F. Kennedy successfully led the Department of Justice in important struggles that have come to symbolize the Department's capacity to do good. Whether fighting against organized crime or for civil rights, Attorney General Kennedy brought out the best in the Department of Justice, working for a more just, free, and law-abiding society. It is fitting that the Main Justice building in our Nation's capital should be dedicated to Robert F. Kennedy's memory, so that generations of Americans yet to come will remember his contributions to preserving justice.

I hereby direct you to designate the Federal Building located at 10th Street and Constitution Avenue, N.W., in Washington, District of Columbia, as the "Robert F. Kennedy Department of Justice Building," and such facility shall be thereafter known and referred to by that name.
