The holiday begins on the first day of the month of Shawwal, which is the month following Ramadan in the Islamic calendar. This year Eid-al-Fitr is expected to be celebrated on December 5 or 6, depending upon when the new moon is sighted.

Muslims rejoice on Eid-al-Fitr at completing the month-long Ramadan fast that has reinforced their service to God and reawakened their compassion for the poor. Traditions on this day include dressing in new clothes, attending a community prayer service, exchanging gifts, and visiting with family and friends. The holiday is a happy time of year for Muslims and reaffirms their feelings of community and brotherhood.

By marking this holy day of Eid-al-Fitr, Muslims are continuing an emerging tradition that is becoming very popular in the U.S. and abroad. Your visit to this mosque reiterates your view that Islam is a peaceful religion and allows you to again call on all Americans to respect American Muslims.

I am honored to visit the Islamic Center of Washington once again. For half a century this beautiful mosque has served as a place of worship for Muslims, and has helped to advance understanding between people of different faiths. Millions of our fellow Americans practice the Muslim faith, leading lives of honesty, justice, and compassion. And I am pleased to join you today in the celebration of Eid al-Fitr [EED el-FIT-ur], the culmination of the holy month of Ramadan.

- Towards the conclusion of the program, you are introduced by Peter Nostrand, Chairman, Pageant of Peace.
- You deliver brief remarks.
- After your remarks, you and Mrs. Bush flip the switch to light the tree, with the help of Samara and Ben.
- At this point, the audience joins the performers in singing "Deck the Halls," "Jingle Bells," and "We Wish You A Merry Christmas."
- You depart at the end of "We Wish You A Merry Christmas."

Thank you very much. With the lighting of the National Christmas Tree, we observe one of the great traditions of our Nation's capital. And throughout the Christmas season, we recall that God's love is found in humble places, and God's peace is offered to us all. Laura and I are pleased to be with you at this Christmas Pageant of Peace.

Thank you, Barbara, for hosting this event. I thank all the entertainers, who captured so well the spirit of the season. I am grateful to Peter Nostrand, and the Board of Directors, and the production team for organizing this fine program. Santa Claus took time out of his busy schedule to join us earlier, and I understand he had to run. Finally, I thank all the good people of the National Park Service. The National Christmas Tree is a living tree – and the Park Service looks after it every day of the year.

For nearly 80 years, in times of calm and times of challenge, Americans have gathered for this ceremony. The simple story we remember during this season speaks to every generation. **Barbara Eden**, everyone's favorite Jeannie, is one of America's most endearing and enduring stars. She has starred in a score of feature films, five television series, and 15 top-rated television movies, and as a singer she has headlined at many of America's top resorts and theatres. Barbara's effervescent personality, positive spirit and unique ability to reach and hold audiences of all ages has made her one of Hollywood's most recognized, beloved and popular stars. Her long-running series, *I Dream of Jeannie*, has been on television screens globally for 35 uninterrupted years. Earlier this year, she completed a successful six-month tour starring in the national company female



**Hei-Kyung Hong**. Blessed with a lyric soprano voice of uncommon beauty and warmth, Hei-Kyung Hong has captured critical and popular acclaim at the world's leading opera houses and concert halls. Since her highly praised Metropolitan Opera debut in the 1984-85 season, she has returned to the Met every season for over 175 performances of 20 different roles. Twice Ms. Hong has been invited to perform on the opening night of the Metropolitan Opera's season – as Zerlina in 2000 and as Gilda in 2001. Hei-Kyung Hong began this season with her first performance of Beethoven's Ninth Symphony with the National Symphony in Washington.





**Mannheim Steamroller.** Chip Davis, Grammy Award winning composer/musician, returns tonight (last appeared on this stage in 1996) to delight another Pageant audience with the unique musical sound of Mannheim Steamroller, the group he created more than 25 years ago. Mannheim Steamroller has sold more than 18 million Christmas albums. Their name comes from Mannheim Crescendo, an 18th century orchestra known for building intensity by adding layers of sound, color, texture, other instruments, and volume. Audiophiles the world over are familiar with the extraordinary sound quality and realism of Mannheim Steamroller recordings, often using them to demonstrate the full range of audio component capabilities.



**Three Mo' Tenors.** Victor Trent Cook, Rodrick Dixon, and Thomas Young are three incredibly versatile operatic tenors. These classically trained singers have taken their talent one step farther, however, by introducing audiences to six additional musical styles – Broadway, jazz, blues, soul, spiritual, and gospel. Mr. Cook received a 1995 Tony Award nomination for his role in *Smokey Joe's Café*. He has been a soloist at the White House and the Kennedy Center. Mr. Dixon has performed with the Lyric Opera of Chicago, Virginia Opera, and Columbus Opera. Mr. Young has performed as principal soloist in the major art centers of more than 20 countries; his theatre, recording and jazz credits are extensive and varied.



**Lee Ann Womack.** From the days of her early childhood in Jacksonville, Texas, Lee Ann Womack dreamed of being a country singer. At the first opportunity, like most aspiring country singers, she headed to Nashville, and there, as a college student, she studied music business. But it was ten long years before Decca Records discovered her and signed her to a contract. Her first album produced "The Fool," a #1 hit that soon went platinum. Other hits followed, but her 2000 hit, "I Hope You Dance," became an anthem for millions of people, and has been lauded by critics all over the world.



**Steve Wariner.** Steve has won virtually every top award the Country Music Association offers. In 1998, his #1 hit, "Holes in the Floor of Heaven," won both the Best Single and Song of the Year awards. It was also the Academy of Country Music's Song of the Year in 1999. Altogether, 14 of his songs reached #1 on the charts, and three albums reached "gold" status. This prolific writer has also crafted hits for others, including Garth Brooks, Keith Urban, and Clint Black. Recently, he received the Minnie Pearl Humanitarian Award in recognition of his work with many charities, including the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation.



**United States Air Force Concert Band.** The flagship musical ensemble of the United States Air Force Band is the Concert Band. This 65-piece world-class symphonic wind ensemble presents over 100 concerts annually, playing a diverse repertoire from light classics, popular favorites and instrumental features to classical works and original compositions for band. Indeed, the Concert Band enjoys an international reputation as a champion of new works for band – with dozens of world premieres to its credit. We are honored to have the Concert Band, a component of The United States Air Force Band, accompanying all performers tonight. Colonel Dennis Layendecker is commander/conductor of the USAF Band.



**Roy Clark** - In the belief that music can bridge continents, Roy's career has followed a path that has taken him around the world many times. Roy is probably best known for his hosting of the popular TV show, *Hee Haw*. He received the Entertainer of the Year award from both the Academy of Country Music and the Country Music Association. Millions know of his Grammy-winning virtuosity but few are aware of his generous support of charitable endeavors. The annual Roy Clark Celebrity Golf Tournament has raised millions of dollars for the Children's Medical Center in Tulsa and St. Jude Children's Hospital in Memphis. He was also the first National Ambassador for UNICEF.
